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LAYTYN

Neuroblastoma Diagnosed December 2021

Laytyn was diagnosed with Neuroblastoma in December 2021 at just 2 months old. A routine checkup appointment changed the Collins' lives in an instant. It wasn't the checkup they expected for their beautiful baby girl.

After noticing some swelling in her abdomen, Laytyn was sent for an ultrasound where doctors found a mass on her right kidney and another on her liver. The family was immediately referred to Children's Mercy for a biopsy, a CT scan and blood work. Within a week, it was confirmed that she had Neuroblastoma and she began chemotherapy treatments immediately.



With two rounds of chemo completed, scans in January 2022 were showing the right side tumor had decreased in size by 68% and the left side tumor had also decreased by 48%. Given the choice, Laytyn's parents opted to discontinue chemo and wait to see how the tumors reacted with follow up appointments every three months.

With all going well, her port was removed in May as planned. However, further testing in August showed a spot on her pancreas which had not been on prior scans. With her urine markers on point, the doctors were confident that the area on her pancreas was an enlarged lymph node.

Laytyn celebrated her first birthday on October 22, 2022. The best gift was knowing that she's a healthy little girl who has shown cancer who's boss!

Today, Laytyn is walking, talking and being a precious, normal, 1 year old little girl!



TESSA

Type B Hodgkin's Lymphoma Diagnosed February 2021

Tessa was diagnosed with stage 4 Type B Hodgkin's Lymphoma on Valentine's Day, 2021 when she was 12 years old.

Despite chemo treatments, the mass on her lung wasn't shrinking. The family received more devastating news in December 2021 when she was diagnosed with thyroid cancer.

Tessa returned to school in the fall of 2021 despite her ongoing fight with cancer. Over the past year, her family has been focused on fulfilling her bucket list. So far, she has enjoyed a trip to Las Vegas, a second trip to Disneyland and a new tattoo!

CALVIN

Myelodysplastic Syndromes (MDS) Diagnosed August 2022

Calvin was diagnosed with Myelodysplastic Syndromes (MDS) in August 2022.

The only cure for MDS is a bone marrow transplant. Although the community came together to help, Calvin's brother was an exact marrow match. Calvin received his transplant on October 26, 2022. After nearly two months at Children's Mercy, Calvin and his mom were able to return home to surprise his siblings! What a great Christmas gift it was for his family!

Calvin will continue regular checkups, but he is doing well! He is hoping to return to school after spring break so things are definitely looking up!



NASH

Medulloblastoma Diagnosed March 2022

In March 2022, at 2 years old, Nash was diagnosed with Medulloblastoma, a brain cancer.

He and his parents traveled to St. Jude's in Memphis shortly after his diagnosis and stayed for nearly eight months. While he was there, Nash underwent three brain surgeries, six rounds of chemo and six weeks of radiation.

Nash and his family returned home just in time for Christmas. They returned to Memphis in early March for more imaging. Sadly, the scans showed a new tumor on his brain about the size of an adult fist.

At this time, Nash remains in Memphis fighting his cancer like a true warrior!



CARL

Pre-B Cell Acute Lymphoblastic Leukemia (ALL) Diagnosed January 2023

Carl was diagnosed with Pre-B Cell Acute Lymphoblastic Leukemia on January 13, 2023, just days after his little sister was born and six weeks before his second birthday.

His parents noticed red dots on his face, bruising on his body and swollen lymph nodes in early January. During his little sister's post-birth checkup, his mom asked the doctor about the things they'd noticed. The doctor ordered labs be done which came back showing abnormal cancer cells in his blood.

Carl had his port placed on January 16 and began chemo the same day. Carl is being treated at Children's Mercy in Wichita.

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HAYDEN

Acute Lymphoblastic Leukemia (ALL)

Diagnosed January 2016 / Relapsed September 2021

Hayden was diagnosed with Acute Lymphoblastic Leukemia (ALL) in 2016 when he was just 7 years old.

After undergoing a high-risk chemo treatment which caused chemical burns on his face and arms, Hayden's 90-day biopsy showed the cancer was gone and he was declared to be in remission.

Sadly, Hayden relapsed in September 2021. Since then, he has endured surgeries, radiation treatments, chemotherapies, heart failure, kidney and liver issues, more chemo induced burns on his body and so much more.

As of this publication, Hayden is home with his family. He is still experiencing chemo burns and other complications related to his treatment.



ANDY

Acute Lymphoblastic Leukemia (ALL)

Diagnosed December 2011 / Relapsed November 2022

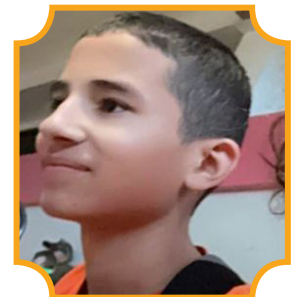
Andy had just celebrated his third birthday when he was diagnosed with Acute Lymphoblastic Leukemia (ALL).

After more than three years of treatment, he was declared to be cancer free in May 2015. Andy enjoyed life as a healthy child for nine short months when his cancer returned again in March 2016.

The second round of Leukemia brought another three year of intensive chemo treatments. In late 2019, Andy began his maintenance phase of treatment after getting the all clear from his oncologist.

In November 2022, Andy and his family received the devastating news that the leukemia had come back yet again.

Andy has his good days and real tough days, too. He is doing as well as can be expected. He's a fighter!



DAMION

Adenocarcinoma Lung Cancer

Damion was diagnosed with stage 4 Adenocarcinoma lung cancer at 16 years old.

In recent months he has transitioned to traditional chemo and radiation treatments to fight his cancer.

Now 19 years old, his January scans showed no new growth and the lung nodules had shrank slightly, which is great news! Damion struggles with fatigue, soreness in his bones, and neuropathy, but is out tinkering on his cars and riding his 4-wheeler whenever he feels up to it. He is showing cancer who's boss!



FAMILY SUPPORT

WARRIOR WAGONS

A warrior wagon is a full-sized, canvas wagon piled high with travel-friendly snacks, activities, toys, Love, Chloe awareness gear, toiletries, comfy clothes, socks, and blankets for the entire family. We also include three gift cards, averaging \$250 total, to the child's favorite restaurants and a \$500 VISA card that the family can use in any way they need to.

The wagon is delivered to families almost immediately after their child is diagnosed since it contains many of the items they will need during their travels and hospital stays.

In recent years, we have had several teenagers who have received a wagon. Each wagon is customized to the child's age, interests and hobbies. We have included everything from a 3-day trip to a custom car show in the Ozarks to art supplies and gift cards so young ladies can shop til they drop!

Once the family empties all of the goodies from the wagon, they can use it to carry their child or luggage in and out of the hospital.

Each warrior wagon has an average value of \$1,500.

FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

Our financial assistance grants are available to Kansas families who have a child in cancer treatment or are attending follow-up visits. The grants average \$1,500 (some are less depending on available funding) and are given once a year to requesting families.

MONKEY IN MY CHAIR

MONKEYINMYCHAIR.ORG

The Monkey In My Chair program was created by Love, Chloe founder, Heidi Feyerherm-Smith in memory of her daughter, Chloe, who loved school and monkeys, to keep kids in treatment connected to their classmates in school.

More than 800 Monkey in My Chair kits are sent each year from our office in Salina to families and hospitals across the U.S., Canada, New Zealand, Australia and most recently, the UK and Ireland!

The Monkey in My Chair kit comes with a large monkey, a small monkey, a book that helps the class understand what the child in treatment is experiencing, a large backpack, a small backpack, and more!



The small monkey stays with the child in treatment while the large monkey stays in the classroom. It does everything the child would do in school, like field trips, going to the library, recess, and PE. The children often dress the monkey in school uniforms or in conjunction with school spirit days. The small backpack also stays in the classroom. It is used to gather notes and pictures for the child in treatment.

Monkey in My Chair kits are always free to families and hospitals, courtesy of generous donors like you. You can sponsor a Monkey in My Chair kit for only \$75!

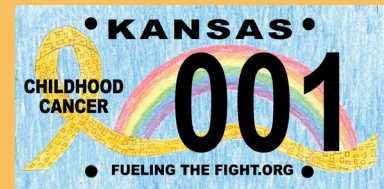


SCAN ME

Our first year of Fueling the Fight has been a success! We exceeded our goal of having 250 license plates on Kansas roads in 2022. In total, there are now 263 with some of those being renewals.



The money raised from our distinctive license plate provides \$250 gift cards to Kansas families who are navigating a childhood cancer diagnosis. We anticipate we will have more than 100 requests for gas cards each year.

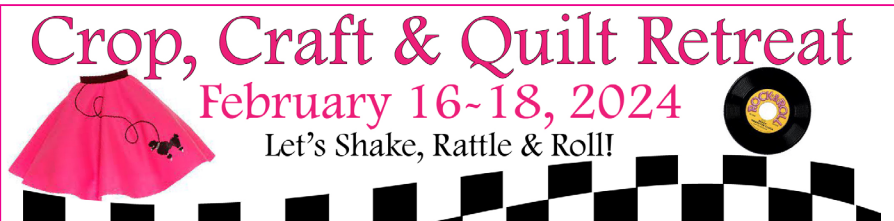

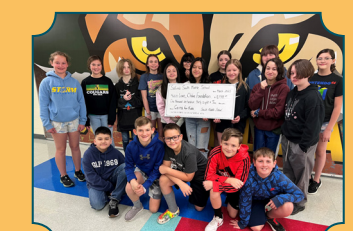

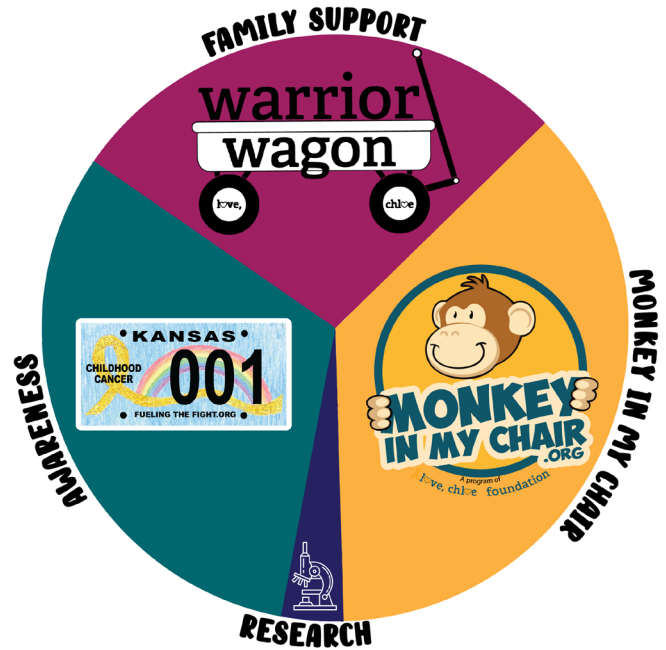
