The Twelve Traditions of Alcoholics Anonymous

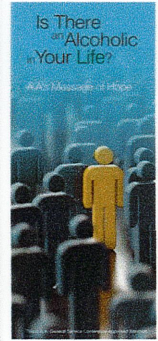
1. Our primary concern is alcoholics only.

5. We will not use the name of Alcoholics Anonymous for financial gain.
6. We will not use the name of Alcoholics Anonymous for publicity.
7. We will not use the name of Alcoholics Anonymous for advertising.
8. We will not use the name of Alcoholics Anonymous for recruitment.
9. We will not use the name of Alcoholics Anonymous for membership drives.
10. We will not use the name of Alcoholics Anonymous for political purposes.
11. We will not use the name of Alcoholics Anonymous for social purposes.
12. We will not use the name of Alcoholics Anonymous for any other purpose.
