Reopening Plan 2020-2021

COVID -19 Symptoms & Testing/Tracing Protocol

If a child or staff member screens positive for COVID-19 symptoms while at school or work or develops COVID-19 symptoms during the program day, meaning they have a fever, or appear symptomatic with any of the current COVID-19 symptoms listed by the CDC, they will be placed in an isolation area. For children, the parent or guardian will be called to pick the child up from school immediately. If it is a staff member they will be asked to leave immediately. Staff and children will be referred to their primary care provider for an evaluation. If the primary care provider determines the symptoms are not COVID-19 related, a note from their primary care provider stating such diagnosis and is cleared to return to the program/work must be given to the program before the child or staff member can return to school/ work. If the primary care provider determines testing is recommended then testing must occur before re-entry to school/work.

If testing is recommended by the health care provider, any symptomatic staff members or children waiting for test results should self- quarantine and will not be allowed to return to school/ work unless a negative COVID-19 test result is supplied to the program.

If the COVID-19 test is positive, isolation will be required for 10 days according to CDC guidelines and symptom free for 72 hours, and a "Release from isolation letter" from the Greene County Public Health Department will be required before returning to school/work. Furthermore, in the event of a positive COVID-19 test result the parent/guardian or staff member must notify the program as soon as possible. The program will then contact the Greene County Public Health Department for confirmation and work with them on contact tracing activities. The Early Childhood Learning Center Director and Health Manager will coordinate with the Greene County Public Health Department for contact tracing.
