## PARKING LOT RESURFACING UPDATE

Depending on our ever-changing weather, global warming, alignment of the stars, etc., **the Lodge facility and parking lot will be closed starting July 3.** PG & E is going to be shut-off at Lodge on July 1st. The parking lot closure on July 4 through 6 is for the paving contractor to prepare for the resurfacing. The parking lot resurfacing and restriping will take place on July 7 and 8. The Lodge office operations will reopen on Tuesday July 9.

The RV area will be closed from **Wednesday July 3 through Tuesday July 9** and **reopen on Wednesday July 10**. Notices will be posted at the RV area and registration, entry doors.

Please note, on July 9 the Lodge office will be open. The RV Park area will reopen on Wednesday July 10th.

Any vehicles left on the premises during this closure will be towed at the owner's expense. We sincerely apologize for any inconvenience.

So, going forward I would like to see all committees have a chairperson and a co-chair.



The California State Parks system has a similar lifetime pass for California residents. There is a program called the Distinguished Veteran Pass and is a lifetime pass for California residents who are honorable discharged veterans and who meet certain eligibility criteria. This entitles the passholder to use all basic facilities (day-use, camping and boating) in state parks for free.
