Take Back Unneeded or Expired Medications Day is Gaturday, April 27.

The Elks DAP promotes a take-back of unneeded prescription and over-the-counter medications. The goal of the program is to provide a safe, convenient, and responsible means for disposing of prescription drugs while also educating the public about the potential for abuse of medications. For more information and to find a drop-off location, go to **dea.gov/takebackday**. If you miss this one-day event this month, don't worry. The DEA provides a search engine to seek out year-round disposal locations near your Lodge. The search engine allows you to search a 5-, 10-, 20-, or 50-mile radius from your Lodge. Go to **deadiversion.usdoj.gov/drug** disposal to find disposal locations.

CVS Pharmacies in Gilroy and Morgan Hill have drop boxes where you can safely dispose of unused and expired medications.
