ENF CHAIRPERSON'S REPORT TO LODGE MEMBERS FOR 2024-2025 GRANTS

The combination of your personal contributions of \$x,xxxx and \$x,xxxx to ENF from Lodge Fundraiser activities brought Gilroy Lodge total to \$x,xxx. Through the ENF Freedom, Gratitude, Spotlight and Beacon Grants that your Lodge applied for we received a total of \$9,500 in grant money. A return of

100% Gilroy Elks Lodge reinvested back into our community.

To recap, here is where the funds from the ENF Grants was reinvested back into our community.

Freedom Grant of \$1,000 went to Project Hero, for the 400-mile California Challenge Bike Ride. The funds are used to engineer, design and build specially adapted bicycles for Veterans to participate in this annual event.

Gratitude Grant of \$2,500 was donated to the JR Adams and Miles Brinson Sports Complex to help support the Youth Activities sports programs for more youth to have access to a safe sports location that is a positive diversion from undesirable activities and build self-esteem.

Spotlight Grant of \$2,000 was split equally between the food bank services of St Catherine's in Morgan Hill and St Joseph's in Gilroy whose mission is to reduce hunger in our area.

Beacon Grant of \$4,000 was donated to One Step Closer an Equine Therapeutic Riding facility whose mission is to help our returning veterans with PTSB and TBI injuries through equine therapy.

As the Lodge ENF chair, I sincerely want to thank everyone who has personally contributed or helped by supporting the Lodge ENF fundraiser activities. This gives significance to the motto Elks Care ~ Elks Share.

Many Americans celebrate Armed Forces Day annually on the third Saturday of May. It is a day to pay tribute to men and women who serve the United States' armed forces. Armed Forces Day is also part of Armed Forces Week, which begins on the second Saturday of May.

Observances are days to celebrate or remember an event, similar to holidays. While holidays usually grant a day off from work, observances don't.

What Is an Observance?

When people celebrate or commemorate something, **but do not have a day off** from work for that reason, we call it an observance. People observe a special day—it might be a religious tradition, a remembrance of a historical event, or a day to focus on an important societal topic like poverty.

Holiday vs. Observance

A **holiday** is associated with **time off from work, school, or other regular activities**. Holidays can be both recognized and sanctioned by governments (public holidays), or they can be informal, cultural, or religious, and not officially recognized by authorities (de facto holidays). In both cases, people usually have time off from work.

An **observance** can similarly be officially recognized or informally celebrated. An observance can be nation-wide or local, religious or secular. In any case, people will likely **still have to work** as usual, and observe the day in their free time.

Different Types of Observances

What Do People Do?

Many events across the United States take place on Armed Forces Day to honor Americans in uniform who served their country in times of war and peace. Those who are honored on this day include people who serve the Army, Navy, Marines, Air Force and Coast Guard. National Guard and Reserve units may celebrate Armed Forces Day/Week over any period in May because of their unique training schedules. Events and activities may include:

- Multi-service military displays in areas open for the public.
- Various educational activities that teach children about the armed forces.
- "Support the Troops" themed motorcycle rides.
- Large parades and other local celebrations.

Missing Man Table

Small table set for one
Symbolizing that some are missing from our ranks

WHITE TABLECLOTH - symbolizes the purity of their intentions to respond to their country's call to arms.

THE BLACK NAPKIN – represents the sorrow of captivity.

A SINGLE RED ROSE IN A VASE – signifies the blood shed to ensure America's freedom.

THE YELLOW RIBBON AROUND THE VASE – represents a demand for proper accounting of those that are not among us today.

A SLICE OF LEMON ON THE PLATE – to show a captive soldier's bitter fate.

GRAINS OF SALT ON THE PLATE – reminds us of the countless fallen tears of families as they wait.

AN INVERTED GLASS – because they cannot toast with us.

AN EMPTY CHAIR - because they are not here.

A WHITE CANDLE – for the hope that all our missing will return someday.





Biography for
California-Hawaii Elks Association President
Scott Stephens



Scott Stephens was born in Detroit, Michigan. After finishing school, at 22 years old, he picked up and moved to California. This turned out to be one of his best decisions, because he met the love of his life, Mary Kay a few years later. They were married in 1987 and have 2 adult children. They spend their time enjoying family, friends, cruising and Elksdom.

Scott has been a member of the Fullerton Elks Lodge #1993 of the Orange Coast District (the OCD as he affectionately refers to it) for 30 years, where he and Mary Kay, have been very involved. He became a Greeter almost immediately and volunteered on the Sunday Brunch committee for 10 years (the last 3 as Chairman). He Chaired their Christmas Tree Lane program for 12 years, hosting 500-600 people & raising approximately \$15,000 annually. He helped at VA Hospital visitations, picnics, and many other lodge programs and was named Elk of the Year in 1999.

Scott became Lodge Chaplain 6 years after joining, then served as Esquire and every Chair Officer position. He was awarded Officer of the Year along the way and became Exalted Ruler in 2003-2004 where he adopted his motto, "Sold on Elksdom". To this day Scott has a great appreciation and respect for the Initiation Ritual, receiving 6 First Place Ritual Trophies (1 All State). He attained his Floor Judge's certification as a Jr. PER, served as a judge for several years and was the Lodge Ritual Coach for 8 years (still helping today). For the past 5 years (and to this day) he's been the editor of the lodge's monthly newsletter, manages the Lodge and District Facebook pages and is the Caller, Emcee & Auctioneer for many Lodge & District fund raiser events.

He served on the District Veterans Committee for 2 years, was the District Americanism Chairman, was Photographer for 2 District Deputies and CHEA Pres., Art Echternacht. Scott served as Esquire to the District Deputy Grand Exalted Ruler in 2015-16. During that time, he was also one of the top ENF fundraising District Chairs in the country for 3 years, and #1 in CHEA for 2 of the 3. The Orange Coast District raised \$364,667 during those 3 years. He and his wife have also raised over \$37,000 for CHEM PI and ENF by hosting 9 cruises over the last 16 years.

At the state level, Scott served as CHEA Vice President for the Orange Coast District (attending all 19 visits, with President Chuck Nolan). He has served as CHEA ENF Vice Chair, in charge of Grants. During which time California-Hawaii Elks Lodges increased their Grant usage by 42 grants, which brought \$278,500 more into our communities. He served 3 years on the CHEA Board of Trustees, finally as its Chairman, and this past year as the CHEA 1st Vice President.

At the Grand Lodge level, Scott served as the Orange Coast District Deputy Grand Exalted Ruler and by Grand Lodge Executive Order, he served as a Special Representative for a neighboring Lodge then was their Lodge Advisor for 6 years. He is currently serving as a Co-District Leader.

As mentioned earlier, Scott's motto is "Sold on Elksdom", because that's what the Benevolent & Protective Order of Elks, deserves from us. Someone once said, "Service is the rent we pay for the space we occupy." Will you serve the Elks a little more, by being **SOLD on ELKDOM?**



Angela Moore Biography

Angela was born in Glasgow, Scotland. She immigrated to the United States in 1976 after her father completed his military career in Scotland. Her family, including her parents, aunts, uncles, and grandmother, lived in Livermore, California. She attended middle school, junior high and high school in Livermore. Angela graduated from high school in 1981 and then moved to Alameda in 1983. She became a U.S. citizen in 1984. Her son Trevor was born in 1984 and is the first-generation Scottish American in the family. Angela started her career as a bartender in 1999. Angela and Trevor followed her parents to Hollister, California where her dad was the General Manager of a bowling alley, and she was the Bar Manager. After working a couple of years at the bowling alley, Angela had the opportunity to work at Hollister Elks Lodge as the Bar Manager. During a Soccer Shoot

event one weekend, the Exalted Ruler (ER), Tim Perera, asked her if she would like to become a member and the rest is history! Angela joined the Hollister Lodge and in 2009 became the first female Exalted Ruler of that lodge. Since that time, Angela has served the West Central District as Chair for Major Project, Veterans, ENF and Government Relations committees. Outside of her Elks activities, Angela worked at Earthbound Farms for 14 years in the transportation department. Unfortunately, the company sold (Life Happens!) and Angela decided to move away from Hollister Lodge and became a member of Gilroy Elks Lodge. She has occupied each of the chairs in the Lodge room and again became the first female Exalted Ruler of the Gilroy Elks Lodge. And then, with one month to go in her ER year, COVID hits and everything shuts down. Life happens again and Angela moved away for a year. Upon her return, she went back to Hollister Lodge for a brief time. But after the passing of her dear mother, she decided to return to the Gilroy Elks Lodge where she went on to be Exalted Ruler for three years in a row. In addition to her responsibilities as District Chair, as mentioned earlier, Angela was a three-time Social Advisor to the Exalted Rulers groups of the California West Central District #1200; the Miners (2017-2018), the Batters (2011-2012) and the Conductors (2012-2013). She has been Secretary to past District Deputy Grand Exalted Rulers, Jim Smith, and Kyle York. As Exalted Ruler, under Angela the Gilroy Lodge was named an "All American Lodge" in their division for the State and National contests. Angela has served as a Procedural Auditor for several District Deputy Grand Exalted Rulers. Angela has one sister, and one brother, one son and two granddaughters.

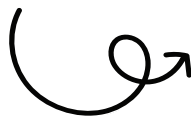
