A Message from Your Exalted Ruler:

Hello Fellow Elks:

The events that were held in July and August were not as good as we had expected for the Lodge. The July 4th Fireworks booth location in July was moved to Monterey Road where customers could not make easy access, consequently we did not sell enough fireworks to make our budgeted projected revenue. One thought says since we lost money, we need to stop selling fireworks for revenue. This decision has other consequences; this revenue source will go away, and you probably will never get this revenue stream back. What is really needed is cooler heads to prevail and starting now to find and secure a better choice location. Both the Italian Night and monthly Rib Night events were sold out and a success.

I want to thank the chairpersons as well as those who volunteered their time to help at each of these events for their hard work, Tom Finkemeier, Sam Bozzo, Steve McGinnis and Courtney Blake-Little.

Tom Finkemeier has informed me that at the end of the year he will be retiring as the chairman of the rib night crew. This will not be an easy task to fill Tom's shoes, but we need to start looking now for a member to chair this popular lodge fund raiser. If you are interested please let Tom or myself know and we'll get you started.

We will be having a DDGER visitation on September 24. I look forward to seeing many of you members here for DDGER Michele Wilson's important visit to Gilroy Lodge with a message from the Grand Exalted Ruler Bryan Klatt.

The first Monday Night Football game tailgater and watch starts on September 8, and Rib Night will be on Friday September 26. I look forward to seeing you there to support our Lodge events and activities.

You may not be aware that the lodge is seriously struggling financially. We've had two events this year that normally are big revenue generators for the lodge operations cancelled; the 2025 New Year Eve Dinner was cancelled at the last minute due to a power outage, and the other was due to a lack of support or interest by the membership. On top of this, the decline in attendance at all Wednesday night dinners is not helping your lodge.

This is your lodge, and members are needed to support events and activities. If there is something happening at the lodge that is bothering or irritating you that needs to be changed or corrected, please see me. I am hearing frequent complaints about the Wednesday night menus, exactly what do you suggest or recommend be changed so you will feel that you are getting the best meal for your money.

I cannot stress enough the importance of keeping the line of communication open between the officers you elected, and the members. Please let us know when we are doing good as well as bad and we will listen and make all efforts to improve. This is your lodge, and we are trying to make it better place for you. If you do not communicate the changes and improvements you would like to see made, then you are a part of the problem not part of the solution, and are willing to accept the decisions.

DECISION 2025

Here is the decision from the vote results taken at the August 13, 2025, meeting.

The Lodge members attending the August 13 meeting have voted in favor of the trustees' proposal to make over the Phil Quast (formerly known as the Mt Madonna Room). Going forward this room shall be known as the "Phil Quast Game Room".

The proposed cash expenditure needed from the Lodge to make this into the game room will not exceed \$350 as all material, labor and everything else is being donated. Any additional items needed for the game room would have to be paid for by rental income from this room.

The trustees anticipate that by installing TVs, a Pool Table and Dart Board in the Phil Quast Game Room for entertainment will make this room attractive to members that do not play cards to hang out at the lodge. Additionally, it is hoped this will make this room more appealing to enable the event coordinator to generate more revenue by renting this room to non-members and lodge members for smaller parties.

At the present time, this room is currently underutilized, and by turning into a "game room" it is hoped this will make the Lodge on the Hill attractive for more family-oriented events.

ENF GRATITUDE GRANT BONUS

Gilroy Lodge exceeded the GER's current per-member giving goal for Lodge Year 2024-2025 (\$5.00/member) and our lodge gave ENF \$6.97. Now for Lodge year 2025-2026 the GER increased the per member amount to qualify for the Gratitude Grant \$5.15. Our Lodge can also earn up to four \$500 Gratitude Grant bonuses by meeting the criteria described below.

Starting in 2025, ENF increased the Gratitude Grant base amount from \$2,000 to \$3,000 which is a nice increase in available Grant monies that our Lodge can apply for and reinvest back into our community.

Are you aware ENF has 4 \$500 bonuses that are dependent upon the achievements from the prior fiscal year for an additional \$2,000 ENF will add to the Gratitude Grant.

This is to keep you informed of the ENF Gratitude Grant bonus opportunities that are available to our Lodge for reinvesting funds back into our community. The decision is yours.

MEMBERSHIP SUPPORT (GOAL 15%) This year, 1 member of our Lodge donated this year. Once the donor support exceeds 15% of the 308 members, (based on the 4/1/2025 membership total) the lodge will have met these criteria for this \$500 bonus.

FIDELITY CLUB (GOAL 1) Currently we have 0 Fidelity Club members. Once we have 1 Fidelity Club Member the lodge will meet these criteria for this \$500 bonus.

CHAIR CHALLENGE SCORE (GOAL 550) The chairman Challenge composite score is currently 51.299. Once the score reaches 550 our lodge will meet this criterion for this \$500 bonus.

FUNDRAISING INCREASE (GOAL 10%) Our Lodge fundraising total was \$2,146. To meet the fundraising criteria for this \$500 bonus, we would need to raise an additional \$3,107.50, which is 10% more than the \$2,825 our lodge raised last year.


