Signs and the ADA

In 1990 the federal government passed the American Disibilities Act to prohibit the discrimination against individuals with disibilies in all areas of public life (work force, schools, transport, etc...). In 1992 guidlines went into effect which included a fair bit of rules on signage. These guidlines have been updated in 2004 and again in 2010. These guidlines still leave a little up to interpratation, and some municipalities have added their own rules which need to be followed.
