# **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

American Indian, Alaska Native, and Native Hawaiian Project (BAA) - This project provides support for the American Indian, Alaska Native, and Native Hawaiian communities (AIANNH) and has been one focus area of MBDA's overall support for minority business development since the Agency's inception. MBDA incorporated feedback in 2015 from six (6) Tribal Consultations conducted to gain an understanding of ways to better support business and economic development needs in the AIANNH communities.

On November 15, 2021 U.S. Secretary of Commerce Gina M. Raimondo was pleased to announce that the U.S. Department of Commerce Minority Business Development Agency (MBDA) is made permanent and will be expanded and elevated with the passage of this historic legislation. This action allows the agency to increase their programs and outreach to the Nation's more than 9 million minority-owned businesses.

# **Achievements**

"President Biden has made clear his commitment to not just rebuilding to how things were before COVID-19, but to building back better and more equitably," said U.S. Department of Commerce Secretary Gina M. Raimondo. "The Minority Business Development Agency is ready to step into this historic moment and build on its success because we recognize that America's road to recovery runs through our minority business community. Making MBDA a statutory Agency provides MBDA with the authorities. workforce and resources needed to help level the playing field on behalf of minority businesses and minority entrepreneurs."

# **Challenges**

There are currently 13 AIANNH designated centers dedicated to serving 574 Federally Recognized Tribal communities across the US - Recognized as Sovereign Governments. The AIANNH centers aim to level the playing field by offering technical support and financial education to address challenges in Indian Country such as limited access to capital, business opportunities, infrastructure, broadband, housing, education, high unemployment, and underserved remote reservation areas. Strengthening Business Owners through the AIANNH Funded Centers takes years to form relationships, given the fact that AIANNH centers are a 2-year program compared to traditional MBDA business centers and other equities is an issue that must be addressed to ensure AIANNH clients and their communities have the necessary resources for growth.

# **Strategic Initiatives**

MBDA provided financial assistance to support innovative projects seeking to impact one or more core needs for AIANNH entities and businesses. HUNAIA Although businesses experience a range of common needs and problems that impede growth, MBDA has identified the following three Strategic Initiatives to support Tribal and Native business growth:



### Innovation and **Entrepreneurship**

(e.g., business training, access to capital, incubators, accelerators, Federal program coaching)



### Strategic **Planning**

(e.g., fostering, developing and/or implementing entrepreneurial and economic development)



### **Transformative Projects**

(e.g., support for MBEs involved in infrastructure focused publicprivate partnerships, and broadband projects)

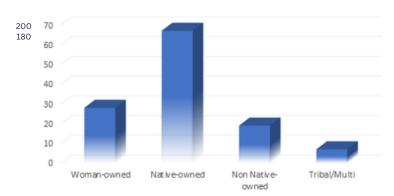

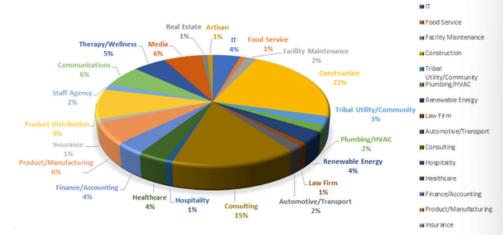


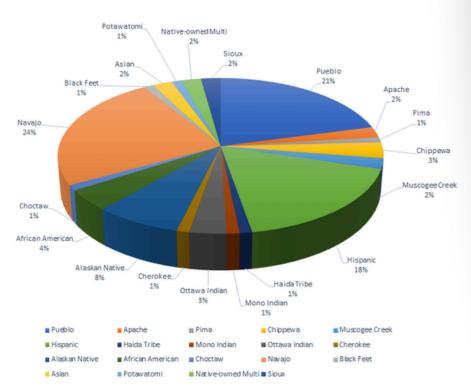
