## **Hebrews 3** New International Version (NIV)

<sup>1</sup> Therefore, holy brothers and sisters, who share in the heavenly calling, fix your thoughts on Jesus, whom we acknowledge as our apostle and high priest. <sup>2</sup> He was faithful to the one who appointed him. just as Moses was faithful in all God's house. <sup>3</sup> Jesus has been found worthy of greater honor than Moses, just as the builder of a house has greater honor than the house itself. 4 For every house is built by someone, but God is the builder of everything. 5 "Moses was faithful as a servant in all God's house,"[a] bearing witness to what would be spoken by God in the future. 6 But Christ is faithful as the Son over God's house. And we are his house, if indeed we hold firmly to our confidence and the hope in which we glory.

<sup>7</sup> So, as the Holy Spirit says:

"Today, if you hear his voice, but do not harden your hearts as you did in the rebellion,

during the time of testing in the wilderness,

<sup>9</sup> where your ancestors tested and tried me,

though for forty years they saw what I did.

<sup>10</sup> That is why I was angry with that generation;

I said, 'Their hearts are always

going astray,

and they have not known my ways.'

<sup>11</sup> So I declared on oath in my anger,

'They shall never enter my rest.' "[b]

<sup>12</sup> See to it, brothers and sisters, that none of you has a sinful, unbelieving heart that turns away from the living God. <sup>13</sup> But encourage one another daily, as long as it is called "Today," so that none of you may be hardened by sin's deceitfulness. <sup>14</sup> We have come to share in Christ, if indeed we hold our original conviction firmly to the very end. <sup>15</sup> As has just been said:

"Today, if you hear his voice, do not harden your hearts as you did in the rebellion."

<sup>16</sup> Who were they who heard and rebelled? Were they not all those Moses led out of Egypt? <sup>17</sup> And with whom was he angry for forty years? Was it not with those who sinned, whose bodies perished in the wilderness? <sup>18</sup> And to whom did God swear that they would never enter his rest if not to those who disobeyed? <sup>19</sup> So we see that they were not able to enter, because of their unbelief.
