

Translation – Present Tense, Activities

Use the present tense, talk about activities

Sali talks to Dewi in the supermarket.

- Sali** Good morning, Dewi. How are you?
- Dewi** I'm tired. I'm buying breakfast.
- Sali** Are you buying sausages?
- Dewi** I don't like meat. I eat bread and butter, cheese and biscuits.
- Sali** Are you buying coffee and milk?
- Dewi** I'm not buying coffee and milk. I drink tea and lemon.
- Dewi** How are you Sali?
- Sali** Very well, thanks. I'm making dinner for Owen.
- Dewi** Are you buying beer?
- Sali** I'm not buying beer. I'm driving. I like to drink water.
- Dewi** Aren't you buying oranges?
- Sali** I don't like oranges. I don't like pineapple either. But, I enjoy eating raspberries and strawberries.
- Dewi** Are you buying vegetables too?
- Sali** I'm buying vegetables ... mushrooms, leeks, peas and ...
- Dewi** Sali, where are you going?
- Sali** I'm buying parsnips ... parsnips ... parsnips!

UNED 03 – Days, Present Tense

Refer to days, use the present tense

Gareth wants to take Sioned out for a coffee. They compare calendars.

Gareth Dydd Llun?

Sioned Dw i'n gweithio ddydd Llun ... a ddydd Mawrth.

Gareth Bore dydd Mercher? Wyt ti'n gweithio?

Sioned Bore Mercher? Dw i ddim yn gweithio ond mae Megan yn sglefrio iâ. Mae hi'n dwlu ar sglefrio.

Gareth Ydy hi'n sglefrio nos lau?

Sioned Dyw hi ddim yn sglefrio ond mae Owen yn cyfrif pannas nos lau.

Gareth Prynawn Gwener? Ydy e'n cyfrif pannas?

Sioned Prynawn dydd Gwener? Dyw e ddim yn cyfrif pannas ond mae Owen a Megan yn mynd am dro.

Gareth Ydyn nhw'n mynd am dro ddydd Sadwrn?

Sioned Dydyn nhw ddim yn mynd am dro ond dw i'n mynd i nofio. Dw i'n dysgu Cymraeg hefyd.

Gareth Dydd Sul?

Sioned Dw i'n smwddio.

Gareth Heddiw?

Sioned Dim diolch, Gareth ... Dw i ddim yn hoffi coffi o gwbl!

Translation – Days, Present Tense

Refer to days, use the present tense

Gareth wants to take Sioned out for a coffee. They compare calendars.

Gareth Monday?

Sioned I'm working on Monday ... and Tuesday.

Gareth Wednesday morning? Are you working?

Sioned Wednesday morning? I'm not working but Megan is ice skating. She loves skating.

Gareth Is she skating on Thursday night?

Sioned She's not skating but Owen is counting parsnips on Thursday night.

Gareth Friday afternoon? Is he counting parsnips?

Sioned Friday afternoon? He's not counting parsnips but Owen and Megan are going for a walk.

Gareth Are they going for a walk on Saturday?

Sioned They're not going for a walk but I'm going swimming. I'm also learning Welsh.

Gareth Sunday?

Sioned I'm ironing.

Gareth Today?

Sioned No thanks, Gareth ... I don't like coffee at all!

Gareth Purple. Do you want to buy a purple car too?

Sioned No. I want a pink and blue bike.

Sioned I enjoy eating a carrot curry and brown rice. I like orange juice.

Gareth I don't like curry. I eat chips and red sauce. I drink green tea.

Gareth I want to buy a small silver phone. Do you want to buy a phone?

Sioned Yes. I want a small yellow phone.

Gareth Do you like a long rectangular cupboard or do you like a square?

Sioned No thank you. I want a circular cupboard.

Sioned Gareth or Owen? Gareth or Owen? I love ... I love Owen.

Gareth Sioned! You don't love Owen! Oh no!!!

- Draig** Does Sioned live in England or in Ireland?
Megan Sioned is staying in the Netherlands but she works in Germany. She's going to Spain tomorrow.
Draig Does she love sailing?
Megan Yes. She wants to sail to France, Italy and Greece.
- Megan** Do you want to visit Europe, Draig?
Draig I want to see Wales. On Saturday, I'm, going to the party. On Sunday, I'm going to the chapel.
