EXHIBITOR'S RULES & REGULATIONS

- In cooperation with the Massachusetts Department of Food and Agriculture, this year's fair is to be held August 17-26, 2018, inclusive at the Marshfield Fairgrounds.
- Premiums and gratuities in all departments of the Fair are open to all exhibitors.
- No discount is made for non-membership.
- Entries must be made only on designated dates and times. See list of entry dates and times in next column.
- Premium lists, programs, posters, or any information regarding the Fair will be promptly furnished upon request to Carleton E. Chandler, Secretary. Please call 781-834-6629 or visit our website at www.marshfieldfair.org.
- No exhibits, games or concessions which violate the rules of the Society or the laws of the Commonwealth will be allowed on the grounds.

SOCIETY REGULATIONS - FOR EXHIBITORS

1. All craft entries are to be made on Saturday, August 11, 10-4 and Sunday, August 12, 10-4.
2. Exhibitors are requested to use the South River Street gate, leading directly to the Agricultural Hall.
3. **Absolutely no entry will be received in any department after the day and hour designated.**
4. All articles, products, flowers, fruits and vegetables offered for premiums must have been manufactured or produced by the person in whose name they are exhibited on or after August 13, 2017.
5. Awards are made in accordance with entries, therefore exhibitors should take care to have stock and articles properly entered.
6. No premiums will be awarded unless entry and required statement have been made according to the rules of the society.
7. In all departments every exhibit should be designated by number of entry only, and no names of exhibitors are to be attached until the awards have been made.
8. Description cards will be furnished to exhibitors who are responsible for filling out and properly displaying with their animals or articles/items exhibited.
9. **Only one entry can be made by the same exhibitor in any one class.**
10. No animal shall be entitled to a premium unless it has been owned by the exhibitor for at least the required minimum amount of time as stated in the Animal General Rules.
11. The best animal will receive a premium, even though it has taken a premium at a previous fair.
12. Premiums will be payable by the treasurer within ten days after the award. If a competitor is dissatisfied with the awards of the committee, a protest shall be made to the secretary in writing, no later than the day following the awards, and the matter may be adjusted by the directors. Any questions regarding premiums paid must be filed with the Marshfield Fair office before December 1st of the year issued.
13. **The Society uses every reasonable means to protect all property on exhibit, but will not be held responsible for loss from any cause.**
14. The exhibitor agrees to be solely responsible for any loss or injury to or damage done, occasioned by, or arising from, any animals on exhibit; and to defend and to indemnify the Exposition and the Management thereof against all claims and liability in regard thereto, and upon these conditions only will entries be accepted. In view of the indemnity agreement appearing on Entry Forms and herein, exhibitors may find it advisable for their own protection to carry liability insurance, if not already covered.
15. To enter a 4-H division, the youth must be a currently enrolled 4-H member in good standing.

Massachusetts Fair 2018 Animal Health Rules

In addition to complying with all laws and regulations governing animal health issues, all fairs must adopt and enforce the following rules for governance of the fair. Refer to www.mass.gov/agr/animalhealth/fair-rules.htm for more details. All State Regulations must be followed.

No animal will be admitted to the fairgrounds unless it meets the requirements below. No animal is to be unloaded or enter a barn or tie-out stall until the animal & its paperwork have been inspected and approved for entry.

A. Animals Generally

1. All animals must be in proper physical condition, be properly identified and free of visual evidence of infectious, contagious or parasitic disease at time of arrival. Specific diseases and conditions which will disqualify an animal for entry are identified for each species in the following sections of the rules. Animals of any species with open or draining wounds will not be approved for entry.
2. Evidence of infectious, contagious or parasitic disease or failure to produce the necessary documents for health certification, vaccination or testing will result in the animal's rejection for entry. The inspector's decision is final.
3. Any surgical procedure or injection of any foreign substance or drug or the external application of any substance which could affect the animal's performance or alter its natural contour, conformation or appearance except external application of substances to the hoofs or horns of animals which affect appearance only, and except for surgical procedures performed by a duly licensed veterinarian for the sole purpose of protecting the health of the animal, is prohibited.
4. All livestock must have proper ID, official metal ear tag, tattoo, scrapie tag for goats and sheep, registration or microchip. Registration forms must accompany health certificates when used as part of official identification.
5. One Official Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (OCVI) may be allowed for animals of the same species to be exhibited at fairs or shows in any of the N.E. states when submitted with an itinerary of the dates and locations of the events at which the listed animal are expected to be shown. Only animals healthy at the time of shipment may be moved. For 2018 fair/show season, livestock animals being exhibited in N.E. states must have official OCIVs that meet the following requirements:
 - a. CT, MA and RI: OCIVs issued on or after Jan. 1, 2018 may be used for animals shown at multiple fairs/shows in CT, MA and RI through the 2018 fair/show season ending Oct. 31, 2018
 - b. A single OCVI from the animal's home state may be completed for travel to and from the N.E. states in which the animals will be exhibited. *MA animals being shown ONLY in MA may substitute a signed, dated letter on the letterhead of an accredited veterinarian for an OCVI if all required information is included and all additional requirements are met.*
 - c. Multiple animals of the same species may be listed on 1 health certificate with appropriate individual IDs and descriptions. Animals of different species may not be listed on the same certificate.
 - d. An itinerary of the names and locations for each N.E. fair/show at which owner expects to show the listed animal and the dates when each animal are expected to be on site, must be prepared by the owner and presented to the veterinarian at the time the OCVI is written.
 - i. A copy of this planned itinerary must be attached to the official health certificate for it to be used for more than one fair/show.
 - ii. That proposed list should be signed by the veterinarian and the owner/exhibitor and reference the relevant OCVI number.
 - e. The name and address of the 1st fair/show where the listed animals will be exhibited is to be used as the "destination" on the OCVI form. In addition, "See attached list" or a similar statement directing Animal Health Officials or Fair Inspectors to the attached proposed itinerary must be included.
 - f. Exhibitors must keep an accurate list of the show location and dates when their animals were actually on the show/fairgrounds. This record must be available to fair inspectors at each inspection and check-in.
 - g. Any animal listed on an OCVI that becomes sick must remain at home. If the animal is refused entry to any exhibition during 2018 for health reasons it must have a new health certificate issued by an accredited veterinarian within 30 days of the next interstate movement.
 - h. Any N.E. state may end their participation in this agreement and revert to the standard published requirements for livestock imports in the state at any time, in the event of foreign animal disease outbreak or changes to state legislation.
7. TB and Brucellosis testing is not required for animals from TB-accredited and Brucellosis-free States and in-state animals. Current brucellosis and TB status in the exhibitor's state can be obtained from the state veterinarian's office in each state. If the exhibitor's state is not TB-accredited or Brucellosis-free, then the exhibitor must call the Massachusetts Division of Animal Health for entry requirements (617-626-1795).
8. Valid and current rabies certificates is required for all (in and out of state) dogs and cats, and is recommended for cattle, sheep, and equine.

All Animal Exhibitors are expected to abide by the state regulations. Please check official website for complete and additional rules.

**There are many new regulations for 2018.
See individual requirements for each species listed below.**

C. Poultry

1. No poultry will be admitted until it has been individually inspected.
2. All poultry must be free of visual evidence of the following diseases: infectious bronchitis, coryza, pullorum-typhoid, fowl-pox, external parasites and laryngotracheitis.
3. Each bird must be accompanied by written proof (ID card or test report) that the breeding flock was blood tested negative for pullorum-typhoid within one year prior to entry date.
4. Birds from quarantined states will not be permitted entry.
5. All birds over 16 weeks of age as of January 1, 2018 shall be individually leg banded with a state leg band including out of state exhibitors.
6. No bird vaccinated for laryngotracheitis within 30 days of the fair will be admitted.

D. Cattle, Goats and Camelids (Llamas, Alpacas, etc.)

1. All of the above must be free of visual evidence of the following diseases: foot rot, mange, pink-eye, warts, ringworm, warts, cow-pox and open or draining wounds.
2. All Goats must also be free of sore mouth and scrapie exposure.
3. Based on the Federal Scrapie Eradication Program (FSEP) goats and sheep of any age or sex brought to show or exhibition from either out of state or within state must possess a USDA approved individual identification tag. Call 508-363-2290 for approved tags, tattoos and electronic implants.
4. Blue Tongue testing is required for Camelids originating from outside the Commonwealth. **Exception:** Animals from a USDA declared "low incident state" are exempt. Note: New England and NY are low incident.
5. While not required, it is strongly recommended that all cattle be currently vaccinated for rabies.
6. All goats and kids presented, regardless of age, must be individually listed and identified on the health certificate.

E. Swine

1. All swine must be identified by an official ear tag or registration.
2. Swine must be free of visual evidence of erysipelas, atrophic rhinitis mange and open or draining wounds.
3. No person shall import into Massachusetts from outside the state any swine which have been pseudorabies vaccinated. M.G.L.c. 129 14E
4. No person shall import into Massachusetts swine from stage I or stage II pseudorabies states.
5. All swine shall originate from qualified pseudorabies free herds, or monitored herds in qualified pseudorabies free states only. The pseudo-rabies status of the exhibitor's state can be obtained from the state veterinarian's office in each state.

F. Sheep

1. No sheep will be allowed entry from flocks in which Scrapie has been diagnosed or in which animals are under surveillance for Scrapie during previous 18 months. Based on the Federal Scrapie Eradication Program (FSEP) and the Massachusetts Emergency Order 1-AHO-60, sheep of any age or sex brought to show or exhibition from either out of state or within the state must possess a USDA approved individual identification tag, tattoo or electronic implant consistent with requirements of the FSEP. Call 508-363-2290 for approved tags, tattoos and electronic implants.
2. No sheep will be permitted entry from flocks in which Soremouth has existed or in which Soremouth vaccine has been administered in the previous 60 days.
3. Sheep must be free from visual evidence of foot rot, sore mouth, pink eye, ringworm, and open draining wounds.
4. While not required, it is strongly recommended that sheep be currently vaccinated against rabies.

G. Rabbits

1. Rabbits must be free of visual evidence of snuffles, wet tail, skin and ear infections.

H. Dogs and Cats

1. All dogs and cats must be free of visual evidence of kennel cough, distemper, hepatitis, parvo, ringworm and mange.
2. All Massachusetts dogs & cats & those originating out of state must have a valid and current vaccination certificate for rabies.

I. Equine

1. All equine entering a Massachusetts fairground must have a valid health certificate.
2. All equine must be free of mange, ringworm, sores, strangles & open or draining wounds.
3. All equines originating from within and outside of the Commonwealth must have a negative USDA approved EIA test dated within 12 months of entry.
4. While not required, it is strongly recommended that all equines be vaccinated for rabies, tetanus, EEE and WNV within one year of the fair.

OPEN ADULT POULTRY SHOW

**Entries close August 1 or sooner if coops are filled.
Poultry entry forms must be mailed separately
from other animal entries.**

- Competition is open to all who make entries and in doing so agree to conform to the rules of the Society.
- Entries must be on blanks furnished by the Society.
- Entry fee of \$1.00 for each entry payable to Marshfield Fair.
- Mail the entry form with full entry fee to: Marshfield Fair, c/o Poultry Dept, P.O. Box 5, Marshfield, MA 02050.
- The Society will not be responsible for any loss or damage from any cause whatsoever.
- All poultry shown at Poultry Shows and Fairs must be blood tested and have a Pullorum-Typhoid Passed or clean ID card. **Send a copy of your card with your entry.**
- All entries must comply with the 2018 Animal Health Rules and Fair Rules.
- **The society reserves the right to reject any entry.**
- During the fair, no birds may be removed from cages by an exhibitor except those exhibitors entered in poultry fitting, showmanship, achievement & demonstrations. Notice must be given to Poultry Superintendent.
- Judging will be in accordance with the American Standard of Perfection and the Judge's awards are final. Judges are empowered to withhold prizes, when in their opinion, the specimens are not of sufficient merit. Prize money will be paid for all breeds accepted by the American Poultry Association included in the Standard of Perfection, including Bantams and Ornamental Fowl.
- Classes are for cocks, hens, cockerel, pullets, production hens, production pullets, meat-type males and females.
- All poultry must be at least 4 months of age.

- All entries must comply with the 2018 Animal Health Rules and Fair rules. (page 32 or at www.marshfieldfair.org)
- The Society reserves the right to reject any entry.
- During the fair, no birds may be removed from any cages by an exhibitor except those exhibitors entered in poultry fitting, showmanship, achievement, and demonstrations. Notice must be given to the poultry superintendent.
- Judging will be in accordance with the American Standard of Perfection and the judge's awards are final.
- Judges are empowered to withhold prizes when, in their opinion, the specimens are not of sufficient merit.
- Prize money will be paid for all breeds accepted by the American Poultry Association included in the Standard of Perfection, including bantams and ornamental fowl.
- Classes are for cocks, hens, cockerel, pullets, production hens, production pullets, meat type males and females.
- All poultry must be at least 4 months of age.

4-H & OPEN YOUTH SHOW REQUIREMENTS

The Marshfield Fair Livestock and Achievement Contests welcomes all youth exhibitors ages 5-18 from anywhere in the Northeast States to compete.

These rules will apply unless otherwise stated in a specific department description.

Ownership of Animals

- Registration papers for purebred animals and lease agreements must be in exhibitor's name and *on file with Ply. County Extension regardless of exhibitor's place of residence* by required date.

Dates: May 1, 2018 Beef, Dairy, Horse, Dog
June 1, 2018 Goat, Sheep, Swine, Rabbits, Poultry

- Bill of sale must have description & identification of animal, date of birth, exhibitor's name and date of sale.
- Sheep/Goat ID - 2018 Animal Health Rules
- Animal health & registration papers will be checked at arrival.

Health of Animals

- All entries must comply with current Mass Fair Rules (page 32)
- Upon arrival all animals will be checked for health. Unhealthy animals will be dismissed from fairgrounds.
- **Upon arrival all animals must be clean and in show condition.**

Care of Animals/Equipment

- Exhibitors must prepare their own animals for shows & classes
- Animals must be clean & in show condition during entire fair.
- Exhibitor must be able to control animal at all times. Unruly animals may be asked to leave the fairgrounds.
- Each exhibitor/family attending should bring a shovel, rake, wheelbarrow, fork, broom, and other necessary equipment.
- Beef & dairy exhibitors are allowed to have another exhibitor care for their animal if they can't be at the fair. They must tell the Livestock Superintendent who will care for their animals.

Barn Rules

- Each exhibitor is responsible for the upkeep and cleanliness of their own animals, stalls, and surrounding areas as well as inside & outside of the barns and show ring.
- All stalls and areas must be cleaned by 11 a.m. everyday.
- Equipment should be put away neatly when not in use. While in use, it should be used in a safe manner and kept out of reach of animals and small children.
- Water buckets should always be clean and full of fresh water.
- Animals removed from stalls cannot be left unattended.
- Animals may not be tied to fences.
- **All cattle must be tethered with two tie ropes attached to a separate halter and/or neck strap. No Rope Halters**
- Bedding will be furnished by the fair.
- Exhibitors must supply their own hay & grain. (Exception: hay & grain for sheep, goats & poultry & grain for swine will be furnished by the fair).

PROOF OF AGE WILL BE REQUIRED
Birth certificate or valid I.D. with age

- Animals weighing over 100lbs. must be accompanied by at least 2 persons when moved about the fair.
- Breed showmanship class is required of all exhibitors and will be divided by age.
 - Pre-Novice - ages 5-7
 - Novice - 1st year showing, ages 8 - 18
 - Junior - ages 8 - 13
 - Senior - ages 14 - 18

- Achievement competitions are divided by age only.
- Exhibitors may only enter one breed & showmanship class per department.

Shared Projects

Exhibitors and 4-H members may share a project animal for showing purposes. Sharing a project should only be done as necessary for participation. Senior and Junior exhibitors may show the same animal on the same day however only one member may compete in any fitting contest. Exhibitors who are in a fitting class or fitting and showmanship combined class will not be eligible for championship placing due to sharing for fitting.

Violations

- Any violation of these rules including early departure, may result in penalty fee, dismissal from fairgrounds and/or forfeiture of all premiums.

Attendance

- All exhibitors under age 18, who are not accompanied at all times by a parent or legal guardian on the grounds, must sign in at the livestock office with their parent or guardian & must be signed out by their parent or guardian at departure time.

Dress

- Exhibitors in the ring must be dressed in white or tan pants or skirt & white top-professional, clean & neat at all times.
- All exhibitors may not appear in painter pants, shorts, halter tops, spaghetti straps, or bare shoulders or midribs at any time.
- All livestock and horse exhibitors must wear hard shoes.
- If at any time, a staff member asks you to change to more appropriate clothing, you must do so.

Conduct

- Exhibitors are expected to maintain appropriate behavior & dress standards while on the fairgrounds.
- No alcoholic beverages, drugs or weapons are permitted.
- Code of Conduct must be submitted with entry.

Premiums

- Questions regarding checks should be filed with the Marshfield Fair office before December 1st of year in which show was held, or within 10 days of receipt of check.

Departure

- **DEPARTURE TIME - AUGUST 27, 6am - noon**
- **Exhibitors needing to remove their animals at an alternate time must submit a written request to Jeff Chandler, P.O. Box 5, Marshfield, MA 02050 prior to the start of fair.**
- Exhibitors must clean & strip their stall & stall areas upon departure.
- No premiums will be paid prior to area inspection and full payment of entry fees.

MARSHFIELD FAIR 4-H AND OPEN YOUTH SHOWS CODE OF CONDUCT

Welcome to the 4-H Youth and Family Development Program and Open Youth Shows at the Marshfield Fair. This is your program and assisting in maintaining its quality and standards is your responsibility. This code of conduct is part of your commitment to the program, yourself, and others who participate in it and enjoy the programs at the Marshfield Fair. You are expected to be sincere, honest and act in sportsmanlike ways at all times. Youth represent the entire program and their behavior reflects on their parents, leaders, club and the entire youth program. All adults involved with the youth program, leaders as well as parents are expected to set positive examples and serve as positive role models by what they say and do. Any youth who breaks the code of conduct or allows another person (adult or peer) to talk them into violating the code of conduct agrees to forfeit all prizes, awards, and premiums. The youth may also be prohibited from exhibiting at this and future exhibitions at the Marshfield Fair.

1. I will respect my fellow exhibitors, volunteers, fair management, general public and others involved in fair activities.
2. I will help whenever needed to present a positive exhibit to the public including interacting with the public daily.
3. I have a responsibility for the welfare of all animals, to the cleanliness of all animal buildings and for the safety of the public.
4. I will respect the rights, property, and privacy of others.
5. I understand that intentional verbal or physical harm will not be tolerated and may be cause for dismissal from the fair.
6. I understand that if I have an unresolved problem with an exhibitor, parent, volunteer or staff, I should go directly to a member of the Marshfield Fair Board of Directors.
7. I will not be rude or disrespectful as it may result in dismissal from the fairgrounds and forfeiture of all premiums.
8. I understand that in the event that I disagree with actions taken under this code of conduct, I may contact the state 4-H YFD office and the Marshfield Fair Management for a review of the actions.
9. I understand that no livestock are allowed in the middle aisles of the barns at any times.
10. Any exhibitor who allows any person other than themselves to groom or prepare an animal for show may forfeit all premiums. Another person may help restrain the animal while the exhibitor fits the animal.
- 11. Any child who leaves the fairgrounds due to a medical issue may not participate in fair activities until cleared by a doctor's note.**

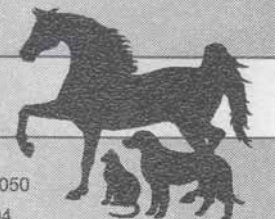

- Animals must have been trained by exhibitor. Exhibitor or family must be legal owner or lease papers must be submitted complying with 4-H Open & Youth Show ownership requirements. Dogs may be pure-bred or mixed-bred. All dogs must be at least 6 months old by show.
- Obedience classes will be held according to AKC Obedience regulations as modified by 4-H.

- All dogs must be on leash or crated when not competing.
- The Show Committee may refuse any dog for health or safety reasons.
- Dogs must have had shots for rabies, distemper, infectious hepatitis and parvo virus. Exhibitor's health record and dog's health record and rabies certificate must accompany entry form.
- Proper equipment must be used to prevent penalty.
- Obedience Show: Dogs in obedience classes must be shown using choke or martingale collar only. No flat or buckle collars. Collars may not have tags. Dog may wear no more than one collar. A 6 ft. training lead must be used.
- Showmanship Show: A showmanship lead is preferred. The size/weight of the lead should be appropriate for the size and/or breed of the dog. Most large dogs should not be shown on lightweight leads.
