Evaluation Forms

The evaluation forms for this event are available [here](#). Consider all tips and suggestions from evaluators offered at previous contests that you have participated in to enhance and strengthen your presentation. Please note that the evaluation criteria may be different from your state presentation evaluation forms and you should adapt your presentation to meet these criteria. You will both give a presentation and evaluate 5 peer presentations using these

forms. Demonstrations and Illustrated Talks will be evaluated using the same criteria, and Speeches will be evaluated using a different set of criteria.

Age Restrictions and Advancement

All presenters must be at least 13 years old in 4-H Age (as of Jan 1st 2021), and have completed at least one qualifying presentation.

Visuals

Visuals may be computer generated or handmade. If handmade, please take a picture of your poster/handout and be prepared to share your screen. Research-based recommendations for slide decks are a minimum of 30 Font and maximum 6 words per slide. Additional slides tips are available [here](#). Visuals are not permitted in the Speech category.

Introductions

Do not squander audience attention by beginning your intro with your name, club/program and years in 4-H. Your room host will introduce you, and you can then dive right in to your presentation.

Appearance

We expect all presenters to dress in a “neat and clean” manner. This has been removed as a rating factor as it is difficult to rate in a virtual environment, but it does not change our expectation to look presentable for your presentation.

Knowledge

Remember to deliver your presentation to the Evaluators and Audience based on the assumption they have **NO** knowledge of your topic.

Be mindful that not everything found online is true or factual. Seek out information that is as unbiased as possible: websites from a .gov or .edu source, books, journal articles etc. [Allsides](#) is a non-partisan resource for bias ratings for news sources. We are part of a research-based educational institution and strive to maintain the integrity of our program.

Citing Sources - *This is a mandatory requirement.

Presenters are required to cite a minimum of 3 reliable sources and may SAY or SHOW IT. If shown, the APA/MLA style of referencing sources is preferred. You can verbally cite sources at the conclusion of presentation and this is not included within the time limit. An automatic "Needs Improvement" will be given if sources are not cited, or if the minimum number of sources is not provided. Plagiarizing is unacceptable.

Time Limits

Time should be used effectively in regards to your content, and *longer is not always better*. Presenters should not exceed 15 minutes and will automatically receive a "needs improvement" if they do. Citing sources is not included in the 15 minute limit.

Benefits of Participation

All participants will receive a certificate of participation. There will be awards for the top scorer and runner-up in both the Demonstration/Illustrated Talk, and the Speech category. Additionally, you will receive public recognition and be eligible for future opportunities based on your participation in this event. Please note this year is our pilot year for this event, and all time has been donated by 4-H Staff and Volunteers who do not yet have a dedicated budget for the event.

Technology Accommodations and Editing

If your Internet is frequently unstable, reach out to your county office to see how they might be able to help. If you are granted an accommodation to film your presentation in advance of the event, you must film your presentation as an unedited, continuous stream. **Please make sure to request this accommodation when registering.** During your presentation, you may show a previously recorded clip where applicable but that too must be filmed as a continuous stream. Camera quality will not be rated.
