4H/YOUTH and OPEN ANIMAL ENTRIES ONLINE



You may now enter all animal entries online.



- 1. Go to (https://marshfieldfair.org/fair/exhibitor-information/4h-and-animals/) select the **Enter Online** button and follow the instructions.
- 2. Click **Create Account** and choose **Individual Account** or **Group Account** if you are a club or family. Be sure to record your username and password.

If you created an account last year, you will still need to create a new account this year. Information is not carried over from year to year.

- 3. Click on **Entries** and then the **Department** then click on the **PLUS sign** to choose the **Class and Lot.**
- 4. Be sure to **upload** any required documents and click **Save Entry**. All required documentation **MUST** be sent with your entry. You can scan documents or take a picture of the required paperwork and submit them with your entry. Be sure all photos can be clearly read. Your health form can be added to any upload or added by going to "Edit Exhibitor Account".
- 5. When you have entered all your contests, click **Review Entries** and be sure all contests are listed and accurate.
- 6. Click **Items/Checkout.** Review all information including number of contests and fees. You must check the **yellow box** to verify you have read and understand the 2025 Animal Health Rules, the Show Requirements and the Code of Conduct. Links are provided to these documents online.
- 7. Click **Print/Preview Receipt** to print a copy of your receipt to be included with your payment. You will receive a verification email of your entries
- 8. We currently do NOT accept payment online. You must pay via one of the following methods:
 - Mail a copy of your invoice and a check to Marshfield Fair, PO Box 5, Marshfield, Ma 02050 by JULY 13.
 - Bring a copy of your invoice to the fair office and pay by check or credit card by JULY 13. A mailbox outside the Fair Office is available if the office is not open. Please leave checks only (NO CASH) with entry forms and all required documents.

Massachusetts Fair Animal Health Rules

In addition to complying with all laws and regulations governing animal health issues all fairs must adopt and enforce the following rules for governance of the fair:

NO animal will be admitted to the fairgrounds unless it meets the requirements below. NO animal is to be unloaded or enter a barn or tie-out stall until the animal and its paperwork have been inspected and approved for entry.

A. General Rules for All Animals:

- 1.All animals must be in proper physical condition, be properly identified and free of visual evidence of infectious, contagious or parasitic disease at time of arrival. Specific diseases and conditions which will disqualify an animal for entry are identified for each species in the following sections of the rules. Animals of any species with open or draining wounds will not be approved for entry.
- 2. Evidence of infectious, contagious or parasitic disease or failure to produce the necessary documents for health certification, vaccination or testing will result in the animal's rejection for entry. THE INSPECTOR'S DECISION IS FINAL.
- 3. Any surgical procedure or injection of any foreign substance or drug or the external application of any substance which could affect the animal's performance or alter its natural contour, conformation or appearance, except external applications of substances to the hoofs or horns of animals which affect appearance only, and except for surgical procedures performed by a duly-licensed veterinarian for the sole purpose of protecting the health of the animal, is prohibited.
- 4. All livestock must have proper official, individual ID as required for the species, e.g. official metal ear tag, tattoo, scrapie tag, or microchip. Breed registration forms must accompany health certificates when used as part of official ID
- 5. One Official Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (OCVI) may be allowed for animals of the same species to be exhibited at fairs or shows in any of the New England states when submitted with an itinerary of the dates and locations of the events at which the listed animals are expected to be shown. Only animals that are healthy at the time of shipment may be moved. For the 2025 Show and Fair Season, livestock animals being exhibited in New England states must have official
 - certificates of veterinary inspection (OCVIs) that meet the following requirements: a. CT, MA, and RI: OCVIs issued on or after January 1, 2025 may be used for those animals being shown at multiple fairs and shows in CT, MA, and RI through the 2025 show/fair season ending October 31, 2025
 - b. A single OCVI from the animals' home state may be completed for travel to and from the New England states in which the animals will be exhibited. MA animals being shown ONLY in MA may substitute a signed, dated letter on the letterhead of an accredited veterinarian for an OCVI if all required information is included and all additional requirements are met.
 - Multiple animals of the same species may be listed on one health certificate with appropriate individual IDs and descriptions. Animals of different species may not be listed on the same official health certificate.
 - d. An itinerary of the names and locations for each New England fair or show at which owner expects to show the listed animals and the dates when each animal are expected to be on each site, must be prepared by the owner and presented to the veterinarian at the time the OCVI is written i. A copy of this planned itinerary must be attached to the official health certificate for it to be used for more than one fair or show.

 ii. That proposed list should be signed by the veterinarian and the owner/
 - exhibitor and reference the relevant OCVI number(s).
 - exhibitor and reference the relevant OCV1 intriber(s).

 E. The name and address of the first show or fair where the listed animals will be exhibited is to be used as the "destination" on the OCVI form. In addition, "See attached list" or a similar statement directing Animal Health Officials or Fair Inspectors to the attached proposed itinerary must be included.
 - f. Exhibitors must keep an accurate list of the show locations and dates when their animals were actually on the show/fairgrounds. This record must be $\,$
 - available to fair inspectors at each inspection and check-in. g. Any animal listed on an OCVI that becomes sick must remain home. If the animal is refused entry to any exhibition during 2025 for health reasons it must have a new health certificate issued by an accredited veterinarian within 30 days of the next interstate movement.
 - h. Any New England state may end their participation in this agreement and revert to the standard published requirements for livestock imports in the state at any time, in the event of foreign animal disease outbreak or changes to state legislation.

ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS FOR EACH SPECIES ARE LISTED BELOW.

- Cattle: See M.G.L. c. 129 §§2, 39 and 330 CMR 4.04(2).
 - TB and Brucellosis testing is not required for animals from TB-Accredited and Brucellosis-Free States and instate animals. Current brucellosis and TB status in the exhibitor's state can be obtained from the state veterinarian's office in each state. If the exhibitor's state is not TB-Accredited or Brucellosis-Free, then the exhibitor must call the Massachusetts Division of Animal Health for entry requirements (617-626-1795). All animals must be free of visual evidence of the following diseases and conditions: foot rot, mange, pink-eye, ingworm, warts, cow-pox and open or draining wounds.
 - While not required, it is strongly recommended that all cattle be currently vaccinated for rabies
- C. Poultry: See M.G.L. c. §§2, 129, and 330 CMR 5.02.
 - No poultry will be admitted on grounds until it has been individually inspected.
 - All poultry must be free of visual evidence of: infectious bronchitis, coryza, pullorum-typhoid, fowl-pox, external parasites and laryngotracheitis.
 - Each bird must be accompanied by written proof (ID card or test report) that the breeding flock was blood-tested negative for pullorum-typhoid within one year prior to entry date.

- Birds from quarantined states will not be permitted entry.

 5. All birds over 16 weeks of age as of January 1, 2025 shall be individually leg banded with a state leg band. This includes out of state exhibitors.
- 6. No bird vaccinated for laryngotracheitis within 30 days of fair will be admitted.
 D. Goats: See M.G.L. c. 129 §2, 9 CFR 79.6 and MA Emergency Order 1-AHO-06.
 1. TB and Brucellosis testing is not required for animals from TB-Accredited and
 - Brucellosis-Free States and instate animals. All goats and kids presented, regardless of age, must be individually listed and
 - identified on the health certificate. All goats must be free of visual evidence of the following diseases and conditions: foot rot, mange, pink-eye, ringworm, warts, pox and open or draining wounds. All goats must also be free of sore mouth and scrapie exposure.
 - Based on the Federal Scrapie Eradication Program (FSEP), goats and sheep of any age or sex brought to show or exhibition from either out of state or within state must possess a USDA approved individual identification tag, tattoo, or electronic implant consistent with the requirements of the FSEP and the MA Emergency Order 1-AHO-06. Information on approved tags and tattoos is available from the USDA-APHIS office in Sutton, MA at 508-363-2290.
- E. Camelids: See M.G.L. c. 129 §2, M.G. l. c. 131, §23, 321 CMR 9.02.
 - TB and Brucellosis testing is not required for animals from TB-Accredited and Brucellosis-Free States and instate animals. Current brucellosis and TB status in the exhibitor's state can be obtained from the state veterinarian's office in each state. If the exhibitor's state is not TB-Accredited or Brucellosis-Free then the exhibitor must call the Massachusetts Division of Animal Health for entry requirements (617-626-1795).
 All Camelids originating from outside the Commonwealth are required to be
 - tested for Blue Tongue. Exception: Animals from a USDA declared "Low Incident State" are exempt. All New England states and New York are low incident states
 - All animals must be free of visual evidence of the following diseases and conditions: foot rot, mange, pink-eye, ringworm, warts, pox and open or draining wounds.
- Swine: See M.G.L. c. 129 §14E, 330 CMR 11.04(2), 9 CFR 71.19
 - All swine must be identified by an official ear tag or registration. Swine must be free of visual evidence of the following diseases and

 - conditions: erysipelas, atrophic rhinitis, mange and open or draining wounds. No person shall import into Massachusetts from outside the state any swine which have been pseudorables vaccinated, M.G.L. c. 129 §14E.
- No person shall import into Massachusetts swine from Stage 1 or Stage 2 Pseudorabies States.
- All swine shall originate from qualified pseudorabies-free herds, or monitored herds in qualified pseudorabies free States only. The pseudorabies status of the exhibitor's state can be obtained from the state vet's office in each state.
- G. Sheep: See 9 CFR 79 and Massachusetts Emergency Order 1-AHO-06.
 - No sheep will be allowed entry from flocks in which Scrapie has been diagnosed or in which animals are under surveillance for Scrapie during the previous eighteen months. Based on the Federal Scrapie Eradication Program (FSEP) and the Massachusetts Emergency Order 1-AHO-06, sheep of any age or sex brought to show or exhibition from either out of state or within the state must possess a USDA approved individual identification tag, tattoo, or electronic implant consistent with requirements of the FSEP. Information on approved tags, tattoos, and electronic implants is available from the USDA APHIS office in Sutton, MA at 508-363-2290.
 - No sheep will be permitted entry from flocks in which Soremouth has existed or in which Soremouth Vaccine has been administered in the previous sixty days. Sheep must be free from visual evidence of foot rot, sore mouth, pink eye,
- ringworm, and open and draining wounds. 4. While not required, it is strongly recommended that sheep be currently vaccinated against rabies. **H. Equine**: M.G.L. c. 128 §§2C, 44 , 330 CMR 16.05.
- - All equines entering a MA fairground must have a valid health certificate.
 - All equines must be free of visual evidence of the following diseases and conditions: mange, ringworm, soring, strangles, and open or draining wounds.
 - All equines originating from within and outside of the Commonwealth must have a negative USDA-approved EIA test (i.e., Coggins test or ELISA test) dated within twelve months of entry.
 - While not required, it is strongly recommended that all equines be vaccinated for rabies, tetanus, EEE and WNV within one year of the fair.
- I. Rabbits: See M.G.L. c. 129 §2
 - Rabbits must be free of visual evidence of the following diseases: snuffles, wettail, skin and ear infections.
- J. Dogs and Cats: See M.G.L. c. 129 §39G1. All dogs and cats must be free of visual evidence of the following diseases: kennel cough, distemper, hepatitis, parvo, ringworm and mange.
 - All dogs and cats must be accompanied by a valid and current vaccination certificate for rabie

All petting zoos are required to have a **USDA APHIS Exhibitor's License and** valid health certificates

4-H & OPEN YOUTH SHOW REQUIREMENTS

The Marshfield Fair Livestock and Achievement Contests welcome all youth exhibitors ages 5-18 from anywhere in the Northeast States to compete.

These rules apply unless otherwise stated.

Ownership of Animals

- Bill of sale/lease must have description & identification of animal, date of birth, exhibitor's name & date of sale.
- Sheep/Goat ID see 2025 Animal Health Rules.
- Animal health papers checked on arrival.

Health of Animals

- All entries must comply with current Mass Fair Rules.
- Upon arrival all animals will be checked for health.
 Unhealthy animals will be dismissed from fairgrounds.
- Upon arrival animals must be clean & in show condition.

Care of Animals/Equipment

- Exhibitors must prep their own animals for show & classes.
- Exhibitors must be able to control animal at all times.
 Unruly animals may be asked to leave the fairgrounds.
- Each exhibitor/family/farm should bring a shovel, rake, fork, wheelbarrow, broom and other necessary equipment.
- Beef & dairy exhibitors are allowed to have another exhibitor care for their animal if they can't be at the fair. They must tell the Livestock Superintendent who will be caring for their animals.

Barn Rules

- Each exhibitor is responsible for the upkeep and cleanliness of their own animals, stalls, and surrounding areas and inside & outside of the barns and show ring.
- All stalls and areas must be cleaned by 11 am daily.
- Equipment should be put away neatly when not in use.
 While in use, it should be used in a safe manner and kept out of reach of animals and small children.
- Animals removed from stalls cannot be left unattended.
- · Animals may not be tied to fences.
- All cattle must be tethered with two tie ropes attached to a separate halter and/or neck strap and tied with a 4-H safety knot.
- Bedding will be furnished by the fair.
- Dairy and Beef Exhibitors must supply their own hay & grain.
- Hay and grain for sheep, goats, and poultry and grain for swine will be furnished by the fair.
- Animals weighing over 100lbs. must be accompanied by at least 2 people when moving about the fair.
- Unregistered animals will be entered in the breed class with animals whose characteristics they share. If purposely crossbred, they will enter the grade class.
- Dogs must be crated when unattended.

 Breed fitting & showmanship class is required of all exhibitors in each department entered and will be divided by age and experience.

> Pre-Novice – ages 5-7 & Cloverbuds Novice – 1st year showing, ages 8-18

Junior - ages 8-13

Senior - ages 14-18

- · Achievement competitions are divided by age only.
- White group is ages 5-11, Green group is ages 12-18.

Shared Projects

• Exhibitors & 4-H members may share a project animal for showing purposes. Sharing a project should only be done as necessary for participation. Senior and junior exhibitors may show the same animal on the same day. Hhowever, only one member may compete in any fitting contest. Exhibitors who are in a fitting class or fitting and showmanship combined class will not be eligible for championship in a category where fitting is counted, due to sharing for fitting. Timed classes are exempt.

Violations

 Any violation of these rules, including early departure, may result in a penalty fee, dismissal from fairground, and/or forfeiture of all premium monies.

Attendance

 All exhibitors under age 18 who are not accompanied at all times by a parent or legal guardian on the grounds, must sign in and out at the kitchen with their parent or guardian. Exhibitors on the grounds for the day must attend the 10 am Barn Meeting.

<u>Dress</u>

- Exhibitors in the ring must be dressed in white or tan pants or skirt and white top – professional, clean and neat.
- All exhibitors may not appear in painter pants, shorts, halter tops, spaghetti straps or bare shoulders or midriffs.
- All livestock and horse exhibitors must wear hard shoes.
- If at any time a staff member asks you to change to more appropriate clothing, you must do so.

Conduct

- Exhibitors are expected to maintain appropriate behavior and dress standards while on the fairgrounds.
- No alcoholic beverages, drugs or weapons are permitted.
- Signed Code of Conduct must be submitted with entry.

<u>Premiums</u>

 Questions regarding checks should be filed with the fair office before Dec. 1 of the year in which the show was held or within 10 days of receipt of the check.

Departure

- DEPARTURE TIME August 25, 6 am noon
- Any exhibitor needing to remove their animal(s) at an alternate time must submit a written request to Jeff Chandler prior to the start of the fair.
- Exhibitors must clean & strip their stall & area upon departure.
- No premiums will be paid prior to area inspection and full payment of all fees.

MARSHFIELD FAIR 4-H & OPEN YOUTH SHOWS CODE OF CONDUCT

Welcome to the 4-H Youth and Family Development and Open Youth Shows at the Marshfield Fair. This is your program and assisting in maintaining its quality and standards is your responsibility. This Code of Conduct is part of your commitment to the program, yourself, and others who participate in and enjoy the programs at the Marshfield Fair. You are expected to be sincere, honest and act in sportsmanlike ways at all times. Youth represent the entire program, and their behavior reflects on their parents, leaders, club, and the entire youth program. All adults involved with the youth program, leaders as well as parents, are expected to set positive examples and serve as positive role models by what they say and do. Any youth who breaks the Code of Conduct or allows another person (adult or peer) to talk them into violating the Code of Conduct agrees to forfeit all prizes, awards, and premiums. The youth may also be prohibited from exhibiting at this and future exhibitions at the Marshfield Fair.

- 1. I will respect my fellow exhibitors, volunteers, fair management, general public and others involved in fair activities.
- 2. I will help whenever needed to present a positive exhibit to the public including interacting with the public daily.
- 3. I have a responsibility for the welfare of all animals, to the cleanliness of all animal buildings, and for the safety of the public.
- 4. I will respect the rights, property, and privacy of others.
- 5. I understand that intentional verbal or physical harm will not be tolerated and may be cause for dismissal from the fair.
- 6. I understand that if I have an unresolved problem with an exhibitor, parent, volunteer or staff, I should go directly to a member of the Marshfield Fair Board of Directors.
- 7. I will not be rude or disrespectful as it may result in dismissal from the fairgrounds and forfeiture of all premiums.
- 8. I understand that in the event that I disagree with actions taken under this Code of Conduct. I may contact the state 4-H YFD office and the Marshfield Fair Management for a review of the actions.
- 9. I understand that no livestock is allowed in the middle aisles of the barns at any times.
- 10. Any exhibitor who allows any person other than themselves to groom or prepare an animal for show may forfeit all premiums. Another person may help restrain the animal while the exhibitor fits the animal.
- 11. Any child who leaves the fairgrounds due to a medical issue may not participate in fair activities until cleared by a doctor's note.

- Develop positive ways to resolve conflict
- Work and communicate with peers, parents, volunteers, and staff
- Work to ensure the safety and order of participants and the barn



- Animals must have been trained by exhibitor. Exhibitor or family must be legal owner or lease papers must be submitted complying with 4-H Open & Youth Show ownership requirements. Dogs may be pure-bred or mixed-bred. All dogs must be at least 6 months old by show date.
- Obedience classes will be held according to AKC Obedience regulations as modified by 4-H.
- Females in season will not be allowed in show.
- All dogs must be on leash or crated when not competing. No aggressive dogs will be permitted. Must have completed a handler evaluation with a dog club leader.

Robert B. Ewing Leadership Award

This is awarded to a Senior 4-H member who sets a good example for others and who best exemplifies the 4-H Pledge. Interview required.

Marshfield Fair Director's Appreciation Award

This award is presented by the Directors of the Marshfield Fair to a 4-H member in recognition of his/her contributions to the 4-H program. Cooperation with the fair management, helpfulness to others, 4-H spirit, and management of 4-H educational exhibits shall be considered in selecting the recipient. Interview required.

Mabel Chandler Memorial Award

Presented to the 4-H exhibitor who displays the most outstanding citizenship qualities. Interviews required.

Marshfield Fair Sportsmanship Award

Three awards will be given to 4-H exhibitors displaying outstanding sportsmanship and fair play in their work and responsibilities at the fair. This award honors the many past volunteers who have made the fair a success.

John C. MacFarlane / Gentle Hands Award
