1. All home canned foods must have been prepared within a one-year period prior to judging date.
2. Entry to consist TWO jars (except where otherwise specified) of each product entered. One jar will be opened for judging the other for display.
3. All entries must be canned using the same brand of jar and lid. New screw rings can be used.
4. Entries must be labeled with product name, date of preparation, processing method and processing time.

Limits: No more than 20 entries. Each entry must be different item. Example you can enter a peach jam and peach jelly but you cannot enter two peach jams.
