Why? It's the best way to enjoy the fair. You can take advantage of our Special Exhibitor Pass that allows admission to the fair EVERY DAY! That way you'll be sure to see, hear and do all that's fun about the annual fair!

What do you do? Find your favorite category, select the correct form on our website or in our office and submit it (the form, not the item) by the entry deadline.

The Adult Entry Form is to be used by all exhibitors 18 years of age or older. This form is also for juniors wishing to enter and be judged in an adult division. Please use a separate entry form for each department you enter, i.e., Home Arts, Art, Floral, etc.

The Junior Entry Form is to be used by all exhibitors under the age of 18 entering in a Junior Division. You may use one form for all your entries, unless you are entering a 4H, FFA Division and a Junior Division, then you would need a form for each department. 4H, FFA, Open Junior are departments.

The entry fee for livestock is \$10/class and a mandatory \$12 fee for a Livestock Exhibitor Pass. Showmanship must be pre-entered and a fee of \$2/class paid at time of entry. A Mandatory Muck-out fee of \$10 per head is also required. Entry Fee's and Exhibitor Passes are subject to change.

Continuing this year we are using paperless online entries! Now we will have online entry forms that will allow you to enter your exhibits without the hassle of bringing them down to the fair. While doing these online entries you will also pay your fees and purchase your passes. Assistance with these online entries can be found at the Fair Office!

## OFFICIAL STATE RULES

The Kings Fair is a District Fair of the State of California Department of Food and Agriculture under the direction of the Division of Fairs and Expositions. **Year 2021 State Rules** for California Fairs may be obtained from their website.

## LOCAL RULES

Carefully read all of the State Rules and be governed by them. ANY PERSON NOT FOLLOWING THE STATE AND/OR LOCAL RULES WILL HAVE ALL AWARDS & AUCTION FUNDS RETURNED. The law has been made by the legislatures of the State of California and is contained in Section 4501 of the Food and Agriculture Code, which governs the operations of state, owned District Fairs.

1. The Board of Directors and Management of the 24-A DAA has the right to refuse the display of exhibits deemed unsuitable in any aspect of the fair.
2. Management of the 24-A DAA has the right to extend any and all entry deadlines at their discretion.
3. **California department of food and agriculture requires all livestock exhibitors to complete the youth quality assurance certification program. This is a web-based program each exhibitor can do at home. Visit [kingsfair.com](http://kingsfair.com) to use the link to register and complete certification. Proof of completion will be required with entry submission.**
4. **CLASSES:** Unless stated otherwise, all classes limited to residents of Kings, Fresno, Tulare, Kern, San Luis Obispo and Monterey Counties with the exception of all Junior Department classes.
5. **ENTRY FORMS:** Must be on official Kings Fair Entry Form and must be received at fairgrounds office or postmarked no later than Wednesday, April 26, 2021 at 4 pm or done online before 11:30pm on April 26, 2021. All Livestock entry forms will be completed online! **Fair management not responsible for errors on Entry Forms.**
6. All divisions or classes will be judged under the American system and/or Danish system as stated in each department.
7. **No cash awards will be given, unless specified in show catalog.**
8. Fair management is not responsible for errors in entries. Reasonable precaution will be taken in protection of exhibits; The Kings Fair will not be responsible for loss or damage, whatever the cause. No exhibitor shall be entitled to an award which has been disallowed as the result of his/her own error.
9. Exhibitors found in violation of rules or unethical or inimical with the fair program shall be penalized by forfeiture of premiums awarded and/or privileges as may be deemed appropriate to the circumstances. Management shall report any such exhibitors to the Division of Fairs and Expositions in writing and such reports may become the basis for any other fair to refuse entries.
10. The fair management shall withhold the payment of awards for exhibits that are determined ineligible under State and Local Rules and may recover awards that has been paid for ineligible entries.
11. A judge's decision is final. Fair management may not request any changes in judge rulings.
12. **No person shall be allowed to interfere with the judge(s) during the decision making process.**
13. **Personal criticisms by an exhibitor, parent, and leader of an exhibit or exhibitor belonging to that person or another person are considered unethical and will result in disciplinary action.**
14. The judge shall have the authority to:
  - a. disqualify or transfer to the correct class any exhibit which does not meet the requirements of the division or class in which it is entered.
  - b. disqualify any exhibit not properly cleaned or fitted.
  - c. disqualify any animal that is in his/her opinion hazardous to public safety.
  - d. examine animals before entering the show ring; and/or refuse any animals which show visible evidence of disease, deformity or lameness.
14. Placement of ribbons on exhibits for display may not necessarily be actual placing. Only the official judging sheet placing will be used for paying premium awards.
15. Ribbons will be awarded for first, second and third place in each class according to merit; if without merit, they shall make no award under any circumstances. If an entry is disqualified AFTER judging is completed, the judge will not change the status of award given for other entries.
16. The judge's decisions on awards cannot be protested. Protests will be considered only if there has been a violation of State or local rules. Refer to State rule V.3 for proper procedure.
17. **LIVESTOCK EXHIBITOR PASS:** In addition to entry fees, the purchase of a special Livestock Exhibitor Pass (\$12) is mandatory for all large livestock and small animal exhibitors. This pass includes one 4 day pass. **IF PASSES ARE LOST THEY WILL NOT BE REPLACED. ALL PASSES ARE NON-REFUNDABLE. NO LIVESTOCK EXHIBITOR PASSES MAY BE PURCHASED AFTER ENTRIES CLOSED.**
18. **SPECIAL EXHIBITOR PASS:** All other exhibitors (not listed above) may purchase a Special Exhibitor's Pass (\$20) by bringing an Exhibit Claim Check to the main office **AFTER JUNE 7TH, 2020**. For more information on this pass please call the fair office. **IF PASSES ARE LOST, THEY WILL NOT BE REPLACED. PASSES ARE NON-REFUNDABLE.**
19. We strongly encourage all fair exhibitors to take advantage of the Special Exhibitor Pass. Spend as much time as you can at the fair.

20. **SEASON PASS:** Non-exhibitors may purchase a Season Pass for \$27.00. The pass allows you to visit the fair every day. **IF PASSES ARE LOST THEY WILL NOT BE REPLACED. PASSES ARE NON-REFUNDABLE.**
21. **PARKING PERMITS:** These car Tags will be issued for the following purposes only: Gate A - Livestock Parking One per livestock exhibiting family. Hanford Armona Lot, Stock Truck/Vendor/RV and Fair Officials (Directors, Management, etc.)  
**NO EXHIBITOR'S CAR WILL BE PERMITTED TO PARK ANYWHERE ON THE GROUNDS EXCEPT IN DESIGNATED PARKING AREAS AFTER THE OPENING OF THE FAIR.**
22. **EXHIBITS DELIVERY DATE:** Dates for exhibits to be in place or delivered for judging are listed at the beginning of each department.
23. **EXHIBIT REMOVAL: Livestock:** All persons exhibiting livestock will be required to obtain Livestock Exhibitor's Release Pass before leaving the Fair. **NO LIVESTOCK OR DECORATIONS** (Except replacement heifers & Milk Cows) will be removed from the fairgrounds before time decided by livestock superintendent on Sunday, June 13, 2021.
24. Livestock release slips must be obtained from Livestock Office Prior to entering grounds with vehicles **OR EXHIBITOR MAY OPT TO REMOVE ALL PROPERTY BY 12 Noon MONDAY, JUNE 14, 2021.**
25. **Commercial/Informational Exhibit Booths:** After the close of the fair, all displays must be properly dismantled, and the space must be left in a neat and orderly manner.
26. **All Other Exhibits:** All other fair (non-livestock) exhibits will be released from the fairgrounds on Monday, June 14, 2021 between 7am and 11am (unless stated otherwise). The Kings Fair will not be responsible for any exhibit, the care of, loss of or damage to any exhibit left as of 11 am, Monday, June 14, 2021.
27. You must submit entry into the outstanding Exhibitor Division and Class to Qualify for Outstanding Exhibitor

ALL UNCLAIMED EXHIBITS WILL BE DONATED TO A CHARITABLE ORTGANIZATION 14 DAYS AFTER THE FAIR ENDS

**28. ADMISSION PRICES:**

- Adults (11 and over).....\$8.00
- Seniors (60 and over).....\$6.00
- Kids 6 through 10).....\$5.00
- Children (5 and under).....FREE

**29. PARKING:**

**LIVESTOCK EXHIBITORS:** Exhibitors receive 1 (one) parking permit per family for \$10.00 in livestock A parking lot. Two Additional Hanford Armona lot passes available for \$25.00 for run of the fair (Hanford Armona lot price is subject to change due to new ownership).

**PUBLIC PARKING:** Public parking is available in the parking area directly north of the main gate and the Hanford Armona Lot at a charge of \$6.00 per auto each time entered on the grounds. The City of Hanford and The County of Kings will post "No Parking" signs on both Tenth Avenue and Hanford-Armona Road during the fair.

**HANDICAP PARKING:** A few spaces have been designated at the main entrance to the fairgrounds to accommodate licensed handicapped fair goers for \$6.00.

MANAGEMENT WILL NOT BE RESPONSIBLE FOR AUTOS TOWED AWAY FROM RESTRICTED AREAS

**30. FIRST AID:** For persons other than employees who are injured while on the fairgrounds, you must immediately notify a fair employee or security guard upon being injured.

**31. SIGNS:** Signs larger than a half card may not be displayed on any exhibit (except livestock barns). No advertisements shall be posted on the grounds or in buildings, except commercial exhibits.

**32. SOLICITING:** Not allowed under any circumstances.

**33. Dogs are not permitted on the fairgrounds** (guide dogs excluded). **NO EXCEPTIONS.**

34. No ice chests are allowed except for livestock exhibitors and must stay in livestock area.

**35. NO ALCOHOL ALLOWED TO BE BROUGHT ON THE GROUNDS IN AUTOMOBILES, ICE CHESTS, SEMEN TANKS OR ANY OTHER CONTAINERS.**

## TENTATIVE LIVESTOCK SCHEDULE

(Subject to Change - Dependent upon number of Entries per Species)

1. MASKS, TEMPATURE CHECKS AND RELEASE OF LIABILITY WAIVERS WILL BE REQUIRED BEFORE ENTRANCE TO FAIRGROUNDS!
2. ALL TRAILERS MUST PARK IN THE HANFROD ARMONA LOT (OLD CVC PARKING LOT) BEFORE SHOWS WILL BEGIN.
3. ALL CAR PASSES WILL BE USED IN THE LIVESTOCK PARKING LOT AND USE THE HANFORD ARMONA LOT (OLD CVC PARKING LOT) FOR OVERFLOW.

### MONDAY, JUNE 7<sup>TH</sup>

Poultry Check-In, Inspection and Weigh-in between 9 am – 10 am

Poultry Meat Pens and Showmanship Judging beginning promptly at 10:30 am

Load Out: once all judging is completed animals will be assigned a load out slot and will leave the fairgrounds.

Drop Off: All animals will be delivered to Overland Stock Yards on Sunday June 13<sup>th</sup> during their assigned drop off time. See Sunday's Schedule for drop off assignments.

### TUESDAY, JUNE 8<sup>TH</sup>

Hog Check-In, Inspection and Weigh-in between 6 am – 8 am

**Hog** Show will begin at 11am! The show will start with Showmanship, followed by market class, followed by breeding classes.

Load Out: once all judging is completed animals will be assigned a load out slot and will leave the fairgrounds.

Drop Off: All animals will be delivered to Overland Stock Yards on Sunday June 13<sup>th</sup> during their assigned drop off time. See Sunday's Schedule for drop off assignments.

### WEDNESDAY, JUNE 9<sup>TH</sup>

Sheep and Goat Check-In, Inspection and Weigh-in between 6 am – 8 am

**Goat** Show will begin at 11am! The show will start with Showmanship, followed by market class, followed by breeding classes.

**Sheep** Show will begin promptly following the goat shows completion! The show will start with Showmanship, followed by market class, followed by breeding classes.

Load Out: once all judging is completed animals will be assigned a load out slot and will leave the fairgrounds.

Drop Off: All animals will be delivered to Overland Stock Yards on Sunday June 13<sup>th</sup> during their assigned drop off time. See Sunday's Schedule for drop off assignments.

**THURSDAY, JUNE 10<sup>TH</sup>**

Beef Check-In, Inspection and Weigh-in between 6 am – 8 am  
Dairy Check-In, Inspection and registration paper entry between 6 am – 8 am

**Beef** Show will begin at 11am! The show will start with Showmanship, followed by market class, followed by breeding classes.

**Dairy** Show will begin at 11am! The show will start with Showmanship, followed by replacement heifer and yearling classes, followed by breeding classes.

Load Out: once all judging is completed animals will be assigned a load out slot and will leave the fairgrounds.  
Drop Off: All animals will be delivered to Overland Stock Yards on Sunday June 13<sup>th</sup> during their assigned drop off time. See Sunday's Schedule for drop off assignments.

## JUNIOR LIVESTOCK DEPARTMENT

STATE RULES APPLY WHERE LOCAL RULES OFFER NO DEFINITION

**ALL ENTRIES ARE DUE ON OR BEFORE  
WEDNESDAY, April 26, 2021  
BY 11:30PM (ONLINE ONLY)**

An Exhibitor found in violation of established local or state rules is subject to disciplinary action deemed appropriate by The Board of Directors and/or Management of The Kings Fair.

**The Kings Fair has established rules for show attire for all livestock exhibitors. Refer to individual exhibitor section for attire. No exhibitor will be allowed to show or exhibit wearing blue jeans, open toed shoes or tee shirts. Shirts/blouses must have a collar. Tank tops or sleeveless shirts are not allowed.**

### FFA CHAPTER MEMBERS

FFA members in good standing are entitled to compete in the FFA department for one calendar year following the year in which they graduate from high school.

**Show Attire:** All FFA Exhibitors of livestock must wear the official show uniform while showing their animals, which shall consist of FFA Jacket or shirt emblem (unless deemed by fair management to be too hot), tie/scarf, white pants, white shirt and closed toed shoes. All shirts/blouses must have a collar. Tank tops or sleeveless shirts are not allowed. Hats and/or head gear of any kind SHALL NOT be worn with official show uniform.

### 4-H CLUB MEMBERS

4-H club members must be 9 years old on or before December 31, 2020. Exhibitors are eligible to compete/exhibit through December 31<sup>st</sup> of the year in which they turn 19 years of age.

**Primary level members who are 5 to 8 years of age on or before December 31, 2020 are not eligible to compete in large animal competitions. Primary members may exhibit poultry, rabbits and pygmy goats. Primary members do not have to complete YQCA certification.**

**Primary members may exhibit however may not be judged and are ineligible to participate in the sale.**

**Show Attire:** Every 4-H Club member must wear the King's Fair 4-H uniform while showing their animals. These uniforms consist of 4-H cap worn on head, white pants, white shirt, and tie/collar and closed toed shoes. All shirts/blouses must have a collar. Tank tops or sleeveless shirts are not allowed.

**4-H Club projects MUST be regularly entered in the records of the 4-H Extension Service 60 DAYS PRIOR TO THE OPENING DATE OF FAIR.**

**Market Steer projects must be entered 120 DAYS PRIOR TO THE OPENING DATE OF FAIR.**

### INDEPENDENT JUNIOR EXHIBITORS

Independent Exhibitors, 9 to 17 years of age as of December 31, 2020 (for the Kings Fair) may enter 4-H or FFA Divisions, or Independent Divisions where available. **Independent exhibitors must bring in original documents for proof of age.** (Birth Certificate, Driver's License, California ID Card.) **Exhibitors who are 14 years and younger as of December 31, 2020 will enter in 4-H divisions and exhibitors 15 years and older as of December 31, 2020 will enter in FFA divisions.**

**Insurance:** An insurance of \$35 per family must be purchased at time of entry. You will find the option available during the online entry process.

**Show Attire:** Must wear white pants, white shirt, belt and closed toed shoes when showing livestock. All shirts/blouses must have a collar. Tank tops or sleeveless shirts are not allowed  
TO EXHIBIT LIVESTOCK, INDEPENDENT JUNIOR EXHIBITORS MUST NOT HAVE BEEN IN A JUNIOR ORGANIZATION WITHIN 30 DAYS PRIOR TO FAIR (60 DAYS FOR MARKET ANIMALS OTHER THAN BEEF; 120 DAYS FOR MARKET BEEF CATTLE AND DAIRY REPLACEMENT CATTLE) TO BE ELIGIBLE TO PARTICIPATE. INDEPENDENT EXHIBITORS MUST BE SUPERVISED BY A COMPETENT ADULT WHILE ON GROUNDS.

#### RULES & REGULATIONS

1. **NEW RULE!** THERE WILL BE NO COOKING, EATING OR DRINKING ALLOWED IN THE BARN. NO FOOD AND/OR BEVERAGES WILL BE ALLOWED 40 FEET FROM BARN AND LIVESTOCK. DESIGNATED FOOD AND/OR BEVERAGE AREAS WILL BE MARKED.
2. California Department of Food and Agriculture requires all livestock exhibitors to complete the youth quality assurance certification program. This is a web-based program each exhibitor can do at home. Visit [www.kingsfair.com](http://www.kingsfair.com) to use the link to register and complete certification. Proof of completion will be required with entry submission. Cavy, Dog and Primary Members DO NOT need to complete YQCA certification.
3. Livestock entries must be completed online and are due no later than 11:30 pm. Wednesday, April 26, 2021. No paper entries will be accepted. Fair office will be open from 9 am to 5 pm on April 26, 2021 to answer any questions. A processing fee of \$2.50 per exhibitor will be added to your entry fees.
4. Unless otherwise specified, only residents of Kings County or members in good standing of Kings County 4-H Clubs, FFA Chapters or Grange Organizations may exhibit at the Kings Fair, unless otherwise specified.
5. **Primary members may exhibit however may not be judged and are ineligible to participate in the sale.**
6. All market animals must be contracted to show at the Kings Fair. Contracts for market beef are due February 8, 2021. Contracts for market swine, sheep, goats and prospective steer projects (feeder calves) are due April 5, 2021. There is no limit on the number of animals you may contract. There are entry limitations addressed within the species department in the book.
7. If, after an animal has been contracted and you need to replace the animal due to death or broken limb you must notify the Fair Manager immediately and that animal must be inspected by a fair official. In the case of market beef, replacement must be no closer to the Fair than 120 days. Replacement of rabbit and poultry must be no closer to Fair than 30 days. For all other market animals' placement must occur no closer than 60 days prior to the fair.
8. All Champion and Reserve Champion animals for each specie (sheep, beef, swine & goats) are terminal and must be shipped by fair staff from the fairgrounds directly to a processing facility (i.e. they may not be picked up live or donated to a barbeque). Feeder beef, rabbit and poultry Champion and Reserve Champions are not terminal.
9. THERE WILL BE NO PREMIUMS PAID.
10. Registration papers on registered animals must be verified by livestock management on Wednesday, June 9, 2021 before 7 PM.
11. Exhibitor must declare market animals to show and sell during the Kings Fair with a Market Contract. Contract due dates can be found above in rule #5.
12. Circulations of Petitions are not allowed.
13. No Scooters or Bicycles are allowed on fairgrounds or parking lots.

14. Only animals entered in the show may be on fairgrounds. Unless verified otherwise by management.
15. Club and Chapter Groups may be entered in Livestock office before Wednesday, June 9<sup>th</sup> at 5pm.
16. All livestock exhibitors must purchase a Livestock Exhibitor's Pass (\$12.00) in addition to paying the required Entry Fees. A 4-H Leader, FFA Advisor or Grange Leader from each chapter or club must be on the fairgrounds AT ALL TIMES. Leaders need to purchase credentials. Independent exhibitors must have parent or guardian on fairgrounds AT ALL TIMES.
17. **All Livestock exhibitors selling a market animal must be invoice runners during the Jr. Livestock Auction on Saturday June 12, 2021. A runner schedule will be determined by livestock management and exhibitors will be notified during the mandatory exhibitor meeting Wednesday, June 9<sup>th</sup>, 2021. If any exhibitor doesn't show up to be an invoice runner there will be a penalty determined by Fair Manager.**

<b>SALE ENTRY LIMITATIONS</b>
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Exhibitors are allowed to enter three (3) market animals to the Fair along with Replacement Heifers and Yearling Heifers. Maximum of two (2) market animals per specie. If three (3) market animals are entered the exhibitor must declare which two (2) market animals will be present **before Tuesday June 8<sup>th</sup>, 2021**. Exhibitors **WILL BE** allowed to sell one (1) Market animal **AND** one (1) Replacement or Yearling Heifer. If an exhibitor has two overall Champion or Reserve Champion Market animals and a Replacement or Yearling Heifer, they **MUST** sell all three. The Fair will charge 8% commission on all items sold through the Jr. Livestock Auction or Dairy Replacement Sale, and will be taken from Exhibitor Check.

Exhibitors showing and/or selling an animal through the Kings Fair Dairy Sale or the Junior Livestock Auction are required to be present in the arena at the time of the show and sale. Violations of this rule will result in the following:

- 1) a penalty-fee deduction of **25%** from the net sale price of the animal; and
- 2) A **one (1) year suspension** from all activities (including showing and selling of animals, etc.) at the Kings Fair for each offending exhibitor.

Exception: if an exhibitor has two (2) or more animals in the same class another exhibitor may show one of the animals. If an exhibitor is unable to show his/her own animal(s) due to a medical reason or a school related absence, the exhibitor must submit a signed letter by the exhibitor and doctor, or school principal and it must be approved by the Fair Manager. All letters must be submitted to Fair Office 2 week prior to opening day of fair.

<b>STATE RULES</b>
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1. Market beef must be owned 120 **consecutive** days prior to fair; 60 **consecutive** days for market sheep, swine, prospective steer project calves and goats.
2. Breeding and feeder animals must be owned 30 **consecutive** days prior to fair.
3. Rabbits and poultry must be owned 30 **consecutive** days prior to fair.
4. All animals in "**Registered Purebred Breeding Animal**" divisions must be registered and recorded with a **United States (U.S.) Breed Association** or through the Canadian Breed Association in the **exact** name of the exhibitor (owner) as declared on the entry form. Animals entered in registered classes or are eligible to show as registered animals may not be transferred or shown in grade or unregistered classes. Animals entered in market/sale classes may not be shown in breeding classes or vice versa under any circumstances.
5. Joint Ownership - Breeding Divisions - No livestock (excluding rabbit and poultry) owned solely by a chapter or club, or conducted as a joint project by two or more individuals, is eligible in the junior department.
6. Scrapie Requirements for Sheep and Goats: All sheep & goats must have scrapie tags in their ears supplied by the breeder when they arrive on the fairgrounds.



<b>LOCAL RULES</b>
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1. Exhibitors showing more than one market animal must advise livestock superintendent which one they are selling within 2 hours of showing their last animal. Failure to declare will result in all animals being scratched. No exceptions!
2. The livestock office will be open starting Sunday, June 6, 2021, Livestock office phone: 583-0771. Barn assignments will be posted by Noon, June 6, 2021, **No setup prior to Noon on June 6th. No tents or easy-ups will be set prior to June 6<sup>th</sup>, before 12 Noon. Tents & easy-ups may not block driveways or unloading zones and must be 20 feet from any barns and/or buildings. Anyone that blocks driveways or unloading zones along with areas not designated for tents or easy-ups will have their easy-ups or equipment removed and must be picked up from livestock office. No BBQ's allowed under the barns or under easy-ups.** We suggest you wait until security is in place (Tuesday, June 8<sup>th</sup>) to begin work on your display area. Security will be located in the Livestock Barn Area.
3. **Market & Breeding Swine arrive Tuesday, June 8<sup>th</sup> between 1 - 6 pm. All vehicles will enter through Livestock Gate B. All vehicles will exit through Gate A into Livestock Parking lot.**
4. Market hogs will weigh in starting at 6:30 pm, Tuesday, June 8<sup>th</sup>. Scale closes at 8:30pm; All Market Hogs must be weighed Tuesday, June 8<sup>th</sup> by 8:30 pm.
5. **Poultry arrives Tuesday, June 8<sup>th</sup>, 2021 between 4 - 8 pm.**
6. **All other animals may arrive on the grounds starting at 7 am on WEDNESDAY, June 9<sup>th</sup>. All vehicles will enter through Livestock Gate B. Dairy & Beef vehicles will exit out of Gate C. All other vehicles will exit through Gate A.**
7. All other Market Animals must be on fairgrounds by Wednesday, June 9th, 2021 at 5:30pm. Time is subject to change.
8. **REPLACEMENT HEIFERS MUST BE IN PLACE BY 5:00 pm. Inspection will begin at 5 pm in the Dairy Ring. All Replacement Heifers must be inspected by 5:30 pm. Brand papers must be present during the inspection.**
9. The Market Steer Show will be a Slick Shorn Show. All market steers must be slick shorn to within ¼" of hair growth (no more than 7 days prior to fair). Entire steer must be shorn, optional leg area from knee and hock down to tail switch. No adhesive or paint is allowed. Hair sheen can be used. Inspection of steer will be prior to weigh in at the scale.
10. Animals will be weighed once, electronically. If there is a disagreement regarding the weight, the animal will be removed from the scale, the scale zeroed, and the animal will be re-weighed. This weight will become the official weight. The animal will not be allowed to leave the scale area during the testing procedure. Animals failing to meet the required minimum weights will be classified as feeders and allowed to show in a feeder class. There will be only one class of feeders for each species; all organizations combined. Underweight animals are not eligible to sell at auction.
11. **Overweight Animals: Animals exceeding the stated top weights will be classified in a Super-Heavyweight Class and will be allowed to show. Super-Heavyweight market goats, beef, prospective steer project calves and sheep deemed market ready will sell but will only be paid for the top weight listed for each species. Super-Heavyweight hogs will be allowed to show. Hogs weighing between 281 and 290 pounds are eligible to show but will not sell. Hogs weighing 290 pounds and above are not eligible to show in a market class but will be allowed to show in showmanship if it is the only animal that exhibitor has entered. Super-Heavyweight prospective steer project calves and hogs will not be allowed to compete for champion.**
12. Prior year's Round Robin winners are eligible to compete in showmanship classes and future Round Robin Divisions as often as they win eligibility.
13. **PARKING for trucks is located at the Hanford Armona lot. ALL TRAILERS are to be taken home. No trucks or trailers are to be left in the fairground's livestock parking lot or Hanford Armona**

**lot during the fair - THEY WILL BE TOWED AT OWNER'S EXPENSE and OWNER WILL BE FINED \$100 BY FAIR.**

14. Livestock exhibitors will pay \$10.00 for one (1) parking pass **per family** for the Livestock A Parking lot. Due to limited space in Livestock Parking, two additional season parking passes will be available for parking in the **Hanford Armona** lot across the street from the livestock area for **\$30.00 each**.
15. **Livestock A Parking Lot will be Buyers Parking ONLY on Saturday, June 12, 2021 until 2pm. No exhibitor will be allowed to park in Livestock A Parking Lot. Livestock A Parking Passes will be accepted at Hanford Armona lot across from livestock.**
16. Overflow parking is available in Hanford Armona lot once Livestock A Parking lot is at capacity.
17. **PASSES for 4-H Livestock Leaders, FFA Advisors, Exhibitor's Parents and Hanford Armona Parking Permits can be purchased at the livestock ticket booth Wednesday, June 8<sup>th</sup>, 2020, from 10am to 4pm only. Discount admission and pre-sale carnival tickets will not be sold after 4pm Wednesday, June 8<sup>th</sup>, 2020.**
18. **ANY PERSON WHO COPIES THEIR PASS (ES) OR ALLOWS THEM TO BE COPIED WILL BE DISQUALIFIED FROM THE SHOW IMMEDIATELY. ANY AWARDS EARNED OR SALES MADE WILL BE CANCELLED AND EXHIBITOR MUST REMOVE ANIMALS FROM THE GROUNDS, SURRENDER THEIR PASSES AND WILL NOT BE ALLOWED BACK INTO THE LIVESTOCK AREA.**
19. **NO ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES MAY BE BROUGHT ONTO THE FAIRGROUNDS, IN COOLERS, ICE CHESTS, AUTOMOBILES, TACK AND SEMEN TANKS ETC. THESE ITEMS WILL BE SEARCHED.**
20. **FIRST BEDDING** will not be provided. Sheep, Hogs and Goats are to be bedded with shavings; Cattle exhibitors may use shavings or straw.
21. **BARN DECORATIONS & DISPLAYS** must be designed to allow movement of air through the barn. Solid backdrops are prohibited. (Nothing more than 36" above the top pen panel is acceptable in Hog & Sheep barns).
22. **RED TAGGING** will occur if stalls and pens are not kept neat and supplied with necessary clean bedding. Pathways must be kept clean for the convenience of spectators. Anyone not keeping their section of the barn clean and neat may be expelled from the Fair and no awards/sale proceeds will be made to the offender. The Fair will provide staff and equipment to remove waste from the stock pile areas. All exhibitors must bring waste to these specified areas. Exhibitors either not taking care of their animals or having stalls that do not meet the 'clean' criteria will be RED TAGGED. EXHIBITORS RECEIVING A 'RED TAG' ARE NOT ELIGIBLE FOR OUTSTANDING EXHIBITOR. Management will inspect the barns on a daily basis and "RED TAG" pens or stalls found in unsanitary condition. Any exhibitor receiving a second "RED TAG" will forfeit any awards earned. A third "RED TAG" will require exhibitor to remove the animal(s) from the grounds, forfeiture of awards and exhibitor's pass. If exhibitor has already sold the animal the sale will be VOIDED and exhibitor will be held responsible for any fees and/or processing charges.
23. **FEED & SUPPLY HAUL IN** for owners of livestock will be allowed through GATE B from 5 am to 7 am. Your vehicle must carry the necessary feed or bedding and will be allowed to enter for the purpose of caring for and feeding animals only. Exhibitors are not allowed to park in the livestock barn area or Lot "C". Unauthorized vehicles will be towed away at the Owner's expense. Judging will not begin until all unauthorized vehicles are removed.
24. **FITTING, HANDLING & SHOWING OF ANIMALS:** Once an animal is entered in the junior livestock show and arrives on the fairgrounds, all junior show exhibitors must be actively involved and shall care for, fit, groom and wash their own animal.
25. **NO FITTERS! NO OTHER PERSON OTHER THAN THE EXHIBITOR, ADVISOR, LEADER OR THE EXHIBITOR'S PARENT MAY ASSIST IN THE CARE, WASHING, GROOMING AND FITTING OF ANY ANIMAL.** Any junior exhibitor or any advisor/leader or any exhibitor's parents violating this rule will subject the exhibitor to disqualification by the Livestock Superintendent. A decision by the Livestock Superintendent to disqualify an exhibitor for violation of this rule shall be final and shall not be subject

to protest.

26. **Night Hawks are allowed for evening care of animals. Night Hawks are not allowed to wash, groom, fit any animal on the fairgrounds or tamper with animals other than the ones permitted by owner. Night Hawk must be over the age of 21 and may NOT BE AN EXHIBITOR. Night Hawk must remove themselves from fairgrounds prior to 7am. If violated Night Hawk, Exhibitor, and livestock are subject to disqualification by Management and/or Livestock Superintendent. A decision by the Livestock Superintendent to disqualify an exhibitor for violation of this rule shall be final and shall not be subject to protest.**
27. **RELEASE OF ANIMALS and TACK:** Milking Cows will be released on Friday, June 11<sup>th</sup> after the Replacement Heifer Sale until 10:30pm. All other livestock and tack will be released on Sunday, June 13<sup>th</sup>, Market Animal Load Out which begins at 6:30 am. Exhibitors will be issued release slips by club and chapter following the Awards Ceremony at 9 am, Load Out order to be posted, Sunday, June 13, 2021 after Awards Ceremony at 9 am.. For release, exhibitors will enter through Gate B and exit Gate A or C depending on species. Animals left on the grounds after 3 pm on Monday, June 14, 2021 will be charged stall fees at a rate of \$50 per head per day.
28. **SALE CHECKS:** The Fair Office will notify Advisors and Club Leaders when checks are eligible for pickup. **All add-on checks will be disbursed after all add-on funds have been received by the Fair Office from buyers - ABSOLUTELY NO PHONE CALLS REGARDING CHECKS.**
29. **There will be a \$25.00 replacement fee for each check. Checks must be cashed within 6 months.**
30. California Department of Food and Agriculture requires all livestock exhibitors to complete the youth quality assurance certification program. This is a web-based program each exhibitor can do at home. Visit [www.kingsfair.com](http://www.kingsfair.com) to use the link to register and complete certification. Proof of completion will be required with entry submission. Cavy, Dog and Primary Members DO NOT need to complete YQCA certification.

5. **NO CHANGES (buyer number, disposition, etc.) WILL BE ACCEPTED ON THE SALES INVOICE AFTER IT HAS BEEN COMPLETED AND SIGNED BY THE BUYER OR THE BUYER'S AGENT.**

6. 7. A sales commission of 8% will be deducted from each sale to defray expenses of the sale.
