## 2020 Highlights

Another interesting year behind us. The first thing that always comes to mind is the amount of trash the township continues to pick up from the ditches. If you see anyone dumping on the side of the road, please let us know so we can clean it up. This dumping costs the township taxpayer a good amount of money. Replacing stolen speed signs on Big Chip Trail was also an added cost.

Due to the covid-19 virus, running the township got interesting; we had to reschedule meetings and held a couple of them remotely.

We were asked to install speed bumps on Wahtomin Trail on a trial basis. The response we received was both positive and negative. We will reconsider alternatives come spring.

In 2020, we completed the Big Horn Bay Project, which included paving Big Horn Bay Road and Gerhkes Point, and despite everything it worked out very well. The price of oil saved us a considerable amount of money. As part of the project, we installed a digital speed monitor on Big Horn Bay Road. We hope it will help to slow the speed of traffic. We installed a turnaround at the end of Oakwood Terrace, moved the corner on Highland Circle, we took over Caroline Beach Road, which is now Engstrom Way, and did several miles of sealcoating.

In 2021, we are looking into doing a rebuild on 81st Avenue west of Co Rd 6.

If you have any concerns with township workings, please feel free to attend any meeting and voice your concerns. Your input makes it easier for the board to make decisions. Once again thank you for your support.

Everything from grave identification and plot marking to viewing benches and gardens are all the product of selfless individuals who gave their time and resources to this on-going piece of History.

I and my wife Donna have lived in Douglas County for over 40 years. We now live just a stones' throw from Lake Charley Cemetery on Lake Louise. I have been fascinated with Older Cemeteries for many years but have never been involved in actual management of one. When Donna and I were looking for plots to purchase, we were directed to Lake Charley Cemetery by a friend. After our first visit we not only purchased several plots, I inquired as to how to get involved in maintaining this beautiful resting place. I met with several retiring members of the volunteer group, members of the Ida Township Board and offered my services as a full-time manager. Ground Maintenance is still performed by the firm hired by Ida Township, which includes mowing, leaf and debris pickup and trimming. Projects completed this past season included stone pillars to accent the Cemetery sign...road improvement and the addition of two turn-around areas...new weather resistant mulch and flowerpot in the viewing location at the top of the hill...design for new walking paths in the newest portion of the Cemetery...and new markers for all of the existing Pioneer graves.

## **Noxious Weeds**

One of the duties of a township supervisor, each spring, is to patrol the township road ditches, vacant lots and farm fields for weeds that are on the state of Minnesota Noxious Weed List. Ida Township



seems to have an abundance of Canadian Thistle. Wild Parsnip was been found in the south Lake Ida area. Information about the weeds can be found on the MN DNR website.

Please take some time to look for these weeds and either spray or cut them. If you do this, we the board, will not have to send you a letter asking you to take this action. If issues are not addressed, after notification, the board will hire someone to get rid of the weeds and then bill you for the work. If we all work together on this issue we can do our part to help control noxious weeds and "OUR" township will benefit by this combined effort. Thanks for your help!
