Holidays and Celebrations

All foods offered to children while at school must be prepared and/or approved by our Pediatric Health and Safety

Manager. Foods not part of the programs food service are prohibited from classrooms. Please do not send your child to school with outside food or food from home, this includes candy and cake. We understand holidays, religious activities and birthdays are an important part of family



life, however, we serve a very diverse population with many different backgrounds and traditions. In order no child or family feels their background or tradition is less important than anyone else's, our classrooms cannot observe religious or cultural holidays during classroom or group socialization times. Triumph does not conduct holiday or child celebrations including, but not limited to: holiday parties, Valentine exchanges, Halloween costume parties or birthday parties. Instead, we do celebrate seasonal changes that take place during the year. When children initiate discussions or when children direct activities, teachers and staff will follow the child's lead.

Transportation Safety Tips to Remember!!



Leave at the same time every day to meet the bus. It's best to be early. Always have your picture i.d. ready in hand

- 1. Keep your child safe by keeping him/her on the sidewalk away from traffic while waiting for the bus
- 2. When you see the bus pulling up, stand back away from the curb and say your good-byes. Keep all food, drinks and toys with you. Children CANNOT bring these items onto the bus
- 3. Explain to your child to:
 - ⇒ Always wait for a bus to come to a complete stop before approaching it
 - ⇒ Watch for yellow lights on the top of the bus and see them change over to red
 - ⇒ Wait for the bus driver to signal it's safe to board the bus
- 5. If you need to cross the street, always cross 10 giant steps in FRONT of the bus (about 10 feet). NEVER CROSS THE STREET BEHIND A BUS. Make sure all traffic has stopped. Look at the bus driver for a 'thumbs-up' signal. Look both ways; it will then be safe for you to cross
