

THE MEANING OF THE ASHES

During the service on Ash Wednesday, members of the congregation are invited to come forward and have a small cross of ashes made on their forehead. The cross of ashes reminds us of three important things.

(1) Ashes confront us with our mortality and remind us that we will die. We hear the words of God spoken to Adam and Eve, "Dust you are and to dust you shall return."

(2) Ashes are a Biblical sign of repentance. Putting on sackcloth and ashes was a visible indication of sorrow over sin.

(3) Ashes are a sign of cleansing and life. A basic ingredient of soap was lye, made from ashes.
