From the Pastor's View:

Where would we be.... without....?

The New Year is a time to reflect on the many gifts God provides to our church, to our community, and to us as individuals. We look back with gratitude, and ahead with hope. For these reflections, I want to focus on just three extraordinary gifts upon which we depend, and for which we can be grateful: The River, Our Volunteers, and New Starts.

Where would we be without the river? Knife River has been flowing from the North ever since it was launched by the glaciers. Without the river, our church wouldn't be here. I sure wouldn't be here! Built upon the hill, KRLC has been here for 98 long years, a mere speck on the river's timeline. HAVE YOU EVER HEARD OF CHURCHTRAC?

During 2026 you will be hearing more about ChurchTrac and Church Connect.

ChurchTrac is an all-in-one Church software package which integrates many of the activities going on in the church. Everything will be in one place for our staff and members to use once you receive an invitation and training during the first quarter of 2026. What will it include at that time?

- <u>People Database</u>- Everything that is in the church photo directory will be in the People tab only for approved users. Do you need someone's phone #, address or email. This is where you can find it. Do you need to send an email or text to a small group of members? This is where you can choose from an existing group or set up a new one. A good example would be coordination of volunteers.
- <u>Events Calendar</u>-This is an interactive church calendar that everyone can use, and it will be updated daily rather than getting it once a month.
- <u>Worship/scheduling</u>-Our staff can use this to create bulletins, sermons and other worship materials. You will be able to see them once they are completed.
- Your giving-You can track your donations here, print out your giving statements or set up on-line giving to automate your donations.
- Accounting software-you will not have much to do with this section, but the financial people will keep track of all the details of our various financial accounts in this tab. We have been evaluating this webbased program since September and feel it works well. It is not perfect, but it is easy to use.
- <u>Church Connect</u>- This will be the place that you will connect with everything that is available.

I am sure you have lots of questions about how it affects you. Some of you will be excited to see this program become part of our church and others may say it is not for me. Either way is OK. You will not be forced to be a part of this program if you do not want to.

For those who are interested we will start some training in the first quarter of 2026. If you want to see more now, just go to **YouTube** and type in **ChurchTrac** and there are a number of videos. Start with the video "Getting started with ChurchTrac."

Stay tuned. There will be more coming during 2026. You can ask Ed Lee, Treasurer or Melanie McMillion, Volunteer Coordinator about any questions you might have.
