FROM THE INTERIM PASTOR

In recent days, while serving as Interim Pastor at Knife River Lutheran Church, on several occasions an old story has come to mind. It's a story from the Hasidic stream of the Jewish tradition: The esteemed Rabbi Hayyim was asked to describe the rare skills with which he led his congregation. The Rabbi likened his followers to "people lost in a great forest. They chanced upon another man who had been lost even longer. Not realizing this, they asked him to lead them out of the woods. His reply was, 'That I cannot do. But, I can point out the ways that lead further into the thicket, and after that, let us try to find the way together.'"

Now, I certainly do not perceive members of KRLC to be "lost in the woods"! On the contrary, I have been impressed with the congregation's leadership, its gratitude for its long history, its appreciation of its worship traditions, its well-maintained building and grounds, and its far-reaching and generous impact within its community and the world! Within my first twelve days I've enjoyed connecting with members of the Congregation Council, the Executive Committee, the small but capable Staff, the Planning Committee, worship leaders, and the Men's Group. Whew! I have heard stories of gratitude for the past, and I've sensed an eagerness and trust for the unfolding future.

Nevertheless, there are challenges before us. What will be the twists and turns in the trail ahead? Where are the thickets? What challenges... and opportunities... will we find in the forest? Currently, our Congregation Council is seeking five members to serve as a Call Committee. Members will work with Synodical representatives through a prayerful, comprehensive, patient, and steady process in seeking a new, long-term pastoral leader.

How the Hasidic parable does resonate with me, though, is the task of "finding the way together." I look forward to joining other members of KRLC while participating in quality worship; creative programs of Vacation Bible School, Sunday School, Confirmation; and, becoming engaged with other community leaders in the immediate and broader community. I have learned that KRLC has a well-earned reputation for community engagement. The Knife River "Community Steak and Chop Fry" fund-raiser is just one example. I plan to don an apron and help out!

In addition to the work of the Call Committee, I look forward – in the weeks and months ahead – to shaping a creative Transition Plan through which all KR members will be engaged in a process of discernment. Participants will "look back", remembering and claiming key points in the congregation's long history; we will assess the congregation's many strengths; and, we will name and face current challenges. Always, we will be tuned to the Holy Spirit's leadership, opening ourselves to finding the way together.

I am grateful and eager for the opportunities to walk with the people of Knife River. I look forward to knowing you and being known by you. My plan is to be fully engaged with you in worship, in learning, and in service.

You will easily find me in the church office, in the sanctuary, the garden, the woods, and in the community. With gratitude and trust, I look forward to finding the way together.

2025 Outreach Charities

Giving with a joyful heart is one of the most important messages found in scripture. Giving to others is really an attitude towards life. By giving your time, energy, emotional and financial support to others, you receive the joy that God intended for you. God loves a cheerful giver! The members of KRLC take that to heart and always give generously.

How do you do this? Simply, write a check to Knife River Lutheran Church and designate which charity/charities you wish to support. If you are unsure just write <u>local</u> or <u>world</u> outreach as the designation. At the end of the year, you will be provided with your annual giving statement which will include these totals. Please consider these charities for your giving in 2025.

LOCAL OUTREACH

TWO HARBORS FOOD SHELF: One in six Lake County residents experiences a food shortage at some time during the year. The Food Shelf is open Tuesdays each week, and customers receive 60-100 lbs. of food. Emergency non-perishables are available in 20 lb. boxes on Monday-Thursday. Many members of the congregation and community also provide hundreds of volunteer hours annually.

CHURCHES UNITED IN MINISTRY (CHUM): Churches United in Ministry is a 501(c)(3) organization whose programs serve more than 8,000 low-income, homeless, hungry, isolated, or otherwise marginalized community members each year. Founded in 1973 CHUM has the support of forty-four member congregations and offers emergency food, shelter, advocacy, support, and street outreach throughout Duluth. In addition, there are 44 apartments for families with children who are homelessness.

<u>LUTHERAN SOCIAL SERVICES- CENTER FOR CHANGING LIVES:</u> Each year L.S.S. provides services to more than 880 young people experiencing homelessness in the greater Duluth area, making thousands of contacts, providing youth with the resources they need to launch into productive, healthy and independent lives. Most are not homeless by choice. Circumstances put them at risk of dropping out of school, unemployment, chemical dependency, or sex trafficking.

<u>LUTHERAN SOCIAL SERVICES:</u> LSS of Minnesota is affiliated with the six Minnesota synods of the ELCA. LSS reaches children, youth, families, people with disabilities, and older adults through more than twenty-three lines of service. Among them are adoption and foster care services, behavioral health services, crisis shelters for children and services for youth experiencing homelessness, disaster response, employment services & financial counseling.

BEST CHRISTMAS EVER: (BCE), a national non-profit serving families who have fallen upon tough times through no fault of their own. BCE partners with local leaders and businesses to bless each BCE family with a custom & unique Best Christmas Ever, tailored to the family situation. *Kristy Shelerud Pollard* graciously coordinates KRLC's participation.

NORTH SHORE HORIZONS: North Shore Horizons was formed in 1980 to serve individuals and families impacted by domestic violence and sexual assault in Lake County and the surrounding area. Today, the organization serves upwards of eight hundred individuals annually, providing community education, outreach, and trauma-informed services to those impacted by domestic and sexual violence. During this pandemic, they are also serving homeless women with children.

BETHANY CRISIS CENTER: The Bethany Crisis Shelter is short-term, emergency housing in a safe, residential setting which provides support for the physical and emotional needs of youth in crisis 24/7. The Bethany Crisis Shelter in Morgan Park has a new \$3 million home to better serve children and their parents during times of need. The project will replace the current LSS facility for short-term, emergency housing for youth undergoing times of crisis.

NEIGHBOR IN NEED: An Emergency Fund set up here at KRLC for local families in need.

LAKE COUNTY DEVELOPMENTAL ACHIEVEMENT CENTER: Established in 1971, their mission and organizational goals are simple, and hold true over 54 years after they were written: "To support each individual to achieve the highest level of independence." Serving adults with disabilities, services include job skills training, supervised work settings, community integration, individualized programming and socialization skills training.

TOGETHER HERE ELCA: "Together Here" prepares our synod to walk with our racialized and marginalized neighbors in a process of learning, listening, and relationship building grounded in truth-telling and the reconciling love of Christ so that transformational change and healing can occur. Together Here consists of the Advisory Board and two ministry teams: The Bridge Building Task Force and the Anti-Racism Team. The Bridge Building Task Force was created in response to the Northeastern Minnesota Synod Resolution 17.1, our synod's commitment to partner with our Ojibwe neighbors as we repudiate the Doctrine of Discovery. The Anti-Racism Team was formed in 2020 as a Bishop's initiative in response to the needs for social reform.

WORLD OUTREACH

<u>GOD'S GLOBAL BARNYARD:</u> We bought the farm and more! Cows, honeybees, goats, oxen & plow, fish, sheep, pigs, and chicks, wait until you see the year-end total! This is a mission of our Children's Church and VBX! Your generosity earned KRLC the "Holy Cow" award!

ELCA WORLD HUNGER: ELCA World Hunger responds to the root causes of hunger with work in sixty countries around the world, including the US. Cornerstones of this work include hunger education, advocacy and projects focused on agriculture, livestock, water, health care and job training to help people lift themselves out of hunger and poverty for the long term. Between 70-75 percent of ELCA World Hunger funds are spent internationally, and 20-25 percent are spent domestically.

<u>LUTHERAN WORLD RELIEF:</u> LWR helps communities living in extreme poverty adapt to the challenges that threaten their livelihoods and wellbeing and responds to emergencies with a long-term view. It is a member of the <u>Corus International</u> family of faith-based international development organizations, which include <u>IMA</u> <u>World Health</u>, Charlie Goldsmith Associates, Ground Up Investing, and LWR Farmers Market Coffee. One of LWR's flagship programs – started in 1945 and continuing today – is its Quilt and Kit Ministry. Each year, KRLC's quilters along with <u>Lutherans</u> across the United States assemble and donate LWR Mission Quilts, as well as several kinds of care kits to assist people living in poverty in times of emergency or great need.
