### FROM THE PASTOR "Tusind Tak!"

Are you familiar with the Danish phrase, "Tusind Tak!"? I first heard it when I married into Phil's family, which included a Danish Grandmother. My Mother-in-Law might say it to another family member after some helpful gesture, and I learned it means, literally, "a thousand thanks!" As I am preparing to complete my ordained ministry, both at Knife River and within my 39 year span including other ministry settings, it seems to me that I would need at *least* a thousand thanks to do justice to the gratitude I am feeling. I am grateful to God, who called me into ministry and has provided guidance and blessing all along my journey. I am grateful to my family members, who supported my ministry efforts and sometimes made sacrifices so that I could do what was needed. I am grateful to congregations which were willing to call a woman Pastor—Zion in Grand Rapids, Bethlehem in Two Harbors, Knife River-- in each case, for their first time, and who were then unfailingly supportive and affirming. I am especially grateful for the 20 years spent here in Knife River as the first half-time solo Pastor; this has been the Call of my heart and the place in which I felt I was privileged to do my best and deepest ministry. We have been through times of challenge and joy, but through it all God has blessed our partnership; we can truly feel so grateful for how we have grown and thrived throughout this time. A "tusind tak!" can hardly express my gratitude to all of you.

It has been so interesting to me to receive the well-wishes and advice of many as I approach retirement. Humorously, the advice has often been directly contradictory! Some have urged finding other meaningful work to do and another congregational family to be a part of, while others have urged taking at least a 6 month hiatus from any sort of work or congregational engagement. And as I listen to the stories you have shared about your own retirement process, I realize anew how each of our journeys is particularly unique to us. The fact is, none of us knows what lies ahead or how our life journey will continue on, whatever period of transition or life season we may occupy. Here, though, is what we do know: We know that God is always good! We know that God is always present! We know that in Christ, we are bound together in love, wherever our journeys take us. We know that God is always going before us to guide us and behind us to guard us. Maybe that's enough to know.

In closing, I pray God's blessing on each and every one of you individually, and on this congregation, corporately. I know what great things God has in store for Knife River Church! With love and giving a "tusind tak!"---Pastor Susan Berge

### WORSHIP IN MAY

# OUR CHURCH HELPED BEAR THE BURDEN FOR A GREIVING FAMILY

Many of you know I write the Knife River Heritage & Cultural Center monthly newsletter. For the May and June issues, I am writing a two-part story about Captain Charles Anderson who rightly deserves to be called "The Father of Knife River."

He had a colorful life as a US Navy captain in the Civil War and later as a Great Lakes ship owner and its captain. Born in Olso, Norway, he took a liking to Knife River and the Norwegian immigrants living here and became very successful as a landowner and saloon operator.

He married twice with his first wife dying. In the spiral-bound booklet *Memoirs of Knife River*, published by "The Descendants of the Original Settlers," the writers state that "Three of the children of this second marriage to Marie Bugge were lost in the waters of the Knife River right behind their farmhouse: Roy age 13, Pearl age 12 and Thema age 10. They all died on August 4, 1918.

According to the *Memoirs of Knife River*, "At first, they were thought to have drowned, but that theory didn't seem logical, since some were good swimmers, and the water was really not that deep. Folks still remember the funeral service in the little church that still stands today (now Knife River Lutheran Church). The sight of the grief-stricken parents and the three white caskets in the front of the church could never be forgotten."

Years later a felon whom the good captain had befriended with a job, now living in Ontario, Canada, confessed to a priest on his death bed to the murder of all three children. He told the priest he had an argument with Cap over his pay and killed the children in revenge. The priest conveyed the confession to authorities in the U.S. who eventually got the information to Anderson family members.

I have a mental picture of our church filled with a shocked and grieving community and three small white caskets in front. How sad. I know our church existed in 1918 because when we added the addition to our church in 2002, I was removing an outside wall when I found a whiskey bottle wrapped in a newspaper dated 1913. I should note here that in 1913 the church was owned by Presbyterians (!).

I hope that our House of God and the presence and support of the Anderson's church family and the community gave the grieving family some level of solace. Cap Anderson died in July, 1926 at the age of 86 years. Wife Marie (Bugge) died in 1970 at age 88.


