FROM THE PASTOR The Value of the New

As I've mentioned previously, each year I find myself choosing a kind of spiritual theme for the year to come, often based on Bible verses or devotional reading I've done early on in January. In 2024, the theme verse for the year of my devotional book was from Ezekiel 36:26: "I will give you a new heart and put a new spirit in you." The pairing of the verse along with my realization that I had been granted a Sabbatical in February that would include new experiences, led me to focus on the concept of *newness* for the year. As I moved through the months, I was on a kind of *newness watch*, paying additional attention to new people, places, and experiences.

The year included more *newness* than I might have anticipated. There were definitely new experiences on my Sabbatical, including reading new scholarly books on Scripture; traveling through the Ozarks, a new experience for us; and spending time in St. Augustine, also a new destination. I purchased two new musical instruments through the year; a high end Mountain Dulcimer and Olivewood Treble Recorder. Becoming acquainted with these new instruments was engaging and joyful, and the new destinations were refreshing and engaging. Additionally, as a 35th anniversary gift to ourselves, Phil and I bought new appliances for our kitchen, where the youngest appliance was well over 25 years old. The more efficient designs and shiny stainless-steel surfaces have continued to be a daily source of satisfaction. Our daughter and her husband bought a new house in Blaine in the spring and we now have both of our adult children and their spouses living 6 minutes away from each other and just over two hours away from us; this is a *newness* that has inspired and delighted us.

Moreover, we added new members to our community and church this past year, many of whom have become new friends; and a new choir, JOYFUL has begun, which has indeed been a joyful addition to our worship and congregation. There is much to be said about the value of the new!

All of this *newness* I've so far mentioned came in positive or inviting forms, but the idea of *newness* took on greater depth for me in the experience of my Father-in-law's death in February of 2024. I found myself pondering how our God is the God who makes all things new---even us. In deaths like my Father-in-law, or some of the others we experienced this year in our congregation, it was clear that the physical body of that beloved person just couldn't continue to sustain their soul. The only way forward was to be made new altogether, through the power of our Lord, who makes all things new, both in this life and in the next. The *newness* of us and those we love, in the that realm of resurrection, is cause for hope and wonder.

We enter now a New Year--2025. Whatever spiritual theme might become a focus for any of us, God is already there before us, in the New Year, leading the way into the future. Our God, who gifts us with the blessing of the new, as well as making all things new, is our Light as we encounter all that will be old and new to us in this next cycle around the sun. May we be blest in this New Year!

"GOD'S GOODNESS IS IN THE DETAILS." By Paul Von Goertz

I wrote the following for the KRHCC newsletter sometime around 2010, but feel the need to retell it for our newer members.

Mary and I try to take in a choral concert every Christmas. Around this time we took in the Arrowhead Chorale's concert in a beautiful Roman Catholic gothic cathedral in south Superior. We chose that concert because Pastor Susan was singing in it.

We were late to the concert because I got lost ("Never ask for directions.") I dropped Mary off and parked blocks away. I knew I would be late and was not happy about that. As I neared the church, I saw a strange site. There was a woman trying to push a hospital gurney up and over a curb. As I got closer I could see she was struggling frantically and in tears. She appeared to be in her forties. I asked if I could help. The man on the gurney (her husband?) laid motionless and expressionless. He appeared very frail and pale, wearing an oxygen mask, and covered with a thick quilt.

I have no idea how the two of them got into this predicament. I was struck by their love for each other and determination to take in the concert together. Was this concert the prelude for him to see the face of Christ? I offered to help the couple into the church, but she thanked me and said she could "take it from here."

It was God's Goodness that made me late and placed me where I could help this poor couple. It was cold and there was no one else to help them hear the reassuring and comforting words and music that foretells the Savior's birth - and the promise of everlasting life.
