# **Administrative Support Hire**

- The congregation approved increasing the 2025 budget by \$6,000 to cover expenses of the Administrative Support hire at a special meeting on June 22, 2025.
- The position will be offered with a start date of July 7 (Melanie is not available until then to oversee training.) Steve Berger, Ed Lee and Helene Hedlund and Melanie McMillion made up the task force.
- Reminder that Melanie will be available during orientation and training for the Administrative Assistant.
- She will remain an active volunteer and resource for KRLC.

### Plans to gather input from Congregation as we explore what's next for KRLC

- The council is drafting a Congregation Survey to be distributed to gather input. Responses will be compiled and shared. Distribution date TBD
- The council is planning a "table talk" activity that will focus on determining critical skills the congregation is looking for in a new pastor. We will plan it to follow an upcoming worship service . . . exact date TBD
- Once we have an Interim Pastor in place, the council will work with the Interim to explore other activities to seek input regarding the direction for KRLC.
- Results of input will be shared with the Call Committee once formed

- The council will be distributing a questionnaire for individuals interested in serving on the call committee.

KRLC Community Picnic Wednesday, July 16, 2025 5 PM Bring your company or bring a friend! All are welcome! Purpose: To amend the 2025 budget in order to provide monies for hiring a part-time office administrator to perform assigned office duties.

The 2025 KRLC constitution gives the congregational council the responsibility for the employment and supervision of salaried workers. The constitution also requires the approval by the congregation of any expenditure over \$5,000.

Melanie McMillion has expressed the desire to step down from her volunteer duties as the pastor's assistant. THANK YOU SO MUCH FOR EVERYTHING! We sincerely appreciate the many hours you have given over the past 18 years!

The council then authorized a small task force to proceed in creating a job description, advertise, interview and hire a new assistant.

These tasks have been completed and a job has been offered and accepted with the understanding that the funding would need approval.

The estimated cost for 2025 is \$6,030.

Where will we find these dollars?

- 1. Our church was paying about \$7,000 per month for Pastor Susan's salary and benefits. Until the council approves an interim pastor we are only paying for pulpit supply (per Sunday service payment to ELCA ordained pastor to fill in). Once an Interim has been approved their salary and benefits will be determined. This should be somewhat lower because of Pastor Susan's long tenue.
- 2. Ultimately, everything comes down to all of our donations so it is important to keep them steady during this time. It will work if we do this.
- 3. If we have a shortfall we can always fall back on the money we have saved over the past five years. We would prefer not to spend this because we set it aside for the eventual replacement of the roof and a furnace.

I think we should be very thankful to Melanie for all of the time and energy she has given to KRLC! Thank you, Thank you, Thank you!!

This budget amendment was approved at the meeting.
