

STUDY GUIDE FOR THE FINAL WRITTEN TEST

What to study? Here is a list of the categories you should review prior to the final written test. It is very important for you to review prior to the final test. A score of 85% is required to pass the final test. Not passing the test will delay your progress towards taking the field test out and you will have to take another one.

The test is divided into eight major parts:

1. Wisconsin Furbearers - Pictures similar to those on pages 48-49 will appear on the test, with a list of the furbearers' names nearby to help you.
2. Furbearer Tracks as you see them on pages 23-47. These same pictures and dimensions will appear on the test, with a list of all the furbearers' names you had for #1.
3. Capture Devices as shown on pages 86-88. Pictures similar to these will appear on the test, with the names of these devices nearby.
4. Parts of a Foot-Hold Trap as shown on page 87. This same picture will be used with the terms appearing nearby.
5. Jaw Frame Characteristics and Modifications as shown on page 87. The same terminology will be used that you see on that page.
6. Parts of a Body-Grip Trap as shown on page 88. The terms will appear nearby.
7. Parts of a Cable Device as shown on page 129. These same pictures will be used and the terms will appear nearby.
8. Selected Multiple Choice Questions from Homeworks #1 and #2 will finish out the test. You have already seen these and you have the answers to these questions. There will also be a few questions that will require you to respond to some situations that may present themselves on the trapline!

Final Words: *If you study* the diagrams and review your homework assignments you should have no problem passing the test. Remember, you need to score *at least 85%* to pass the test. If you do not score 85%, a second test will be mailed to you identifying those questions you scored wrong. You may use a copy of the current trapping regulations during the test to help you answer questions on the test. Otherwise, no other help is allowed during the test.

Be sure to line up a proctor for taking the final test. It doesn't matter how old you are, you need a responsible adult to administer this final written test.
