

Kasey Turner DIED aged 18

covid vaccine: AstraZeneca

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The inquest into the death of a young woman, who died following the AstraZeneca coronavirus vaccine, found that there had been "missed opportunities" to diagnose a fatal blood clot.

Kasey Turner was just 18 years old when she died, four days after being admitted to Barnsley Hospital with a "thunderclap headache" that was the result of a thrombosis in her sinus cavity. At the time of her admission to hospital, doctors suspected that Kasey might have had a subarachnoid hemorrhage.

But Kasey, a student paramedic, was actually suffering from a cerebral venous thrombosis - a blood clot in the sinus cavity - which had been brought on as a result of the AstraZeneca coronavirus vaccine. Her inquest, which concluded today at Sheffield 's Medico Legal Centre, found that doctors at Barnsley Hospital had "missed opportunities" to diagnose the clot, which would kill Kasey just days later.

The court heard that Kasey, from Barnsley, had received her dose of the AstraZeneca coronavirus vaccine two weeks before her admission to hospital, on February 13, 2021. Due to her role as a student paramedic, Kasey had received her Covid-19 vaccine as part of the Yorkshire Ambulance Service NHS Trust's immunisation programme.
