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Public Alert Sign-up

Whenever a significant incident occurs in Whatcom County, Whatcom Unified Emergency Management (WUEM) uses various methods to notify the media and the public. One of those methods is a messaging system called AlertSense provided by MyStateUSA. A few good ideas to get us started:

Living on the southeast end of the island, Paul realizes that his best option may be to get down to the beach in the event of a wildfire. He purchased a 55 liter Earth Pak brand dry bag with back pack straps for about \$60.This bag is big enough to carry his evacuation supplies. Assembling critical supplies is one thing, keeping them intact, organized, safe from critters, and in an accessible location outside the home is another.
