Scholarship winners will be notified via email no later than **Friday, July 17, 2026.**

NOBLE Metro-Detroit Chapter Scholarship Award Guidelines

Several scholarship awards are offered by the Metro-Detroit Chapter of NOBLE each year.

Applications may be obtained from your school principals/counselors or online at the NOBLE website: <https://nobledetroitchapter.org/>

Eligible applicants must enroll full-time in a two (2) or four (4) year degree program at an accredited college or university for the fall 2026 term.

NOBLE Members and Family Members are Not Eligible to Apply for Scholarships.

ELIGIBILITY:

- Must be a current high school senior who has fulfilled all graduation requirements and received a diploma before the award announcement (before July 2026).
- Must be pursuing a degree in Criminal Justice, any of the Social Sciences, including STEAM, (Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts, Mathematics) forensics-related careers, computer technology, etc.
- Must be accepted to an accredited academic institution (proof of acceptance is required).
- Must be a United States Citizen.
- Must demonstrate a need for financial assistance.
- Must have a minimum of 2.75 cumulative grade point average.
- Must complete and submit the following:
 1. A completed Application
 2. Official School Transcript
 3. Three (3) Letters of Recommendation (Counselor, Teacher, and Community Member)
 4. A two (2) page double-spaced, typed in 12-inch font, the essay authored by the applicant will shall deal with topic of Law Enforcement Relationship with Youth in Urban Areas titled "How can Law Enforcement Officer improve their relationship with our Youth?"

If an applicant is selected as a finalist, they must submit to a 15-minute interview. Please dress in appropriate business attire.
