

HISTORY OF THE REGINALD TURNER, SR. SCHOLARSHIP CHARITY GOLF OUTING

- Reginald Turner Sr. worked for the Detroit Police Department for 25 years. He retired as a Deputy Chief for Eastern Operations.
- On the Cities Eastside Reginald Turner Sr. led the effort to end the reign of terror of the east side gangs such as the Black Killers and Errol Flynn's.
- During his tenure, Reginald Turner Sr. was one of the founding members of the Metro-Detroit Chapter of NOBLE and served on its Board of Directors for many years.
- In 1981, Reginald Turner, Sr. left the City of Detroit for Cleveland, Ohio to become the Public Safety Director for five years.
- Mr. Turner returned to Michigan in 1986 as the Chief of Police with the Pontiac Police Department. He was an avid golfer and founded the NOBLE Scholarship Golf Outing.
- After the passing of Reginald Turner Sr. in 1990 the Metro-Detroit Chapter named the scholarship The Reginald Turner Sr. Scholarship Fund.
- The Turner family is very grateful to the Metro-Detroit Chapter of NOBLE for keeping the memory of Reginald Turner Sr. alive with the Charity Golf Outing Scholarship Fund. They are present at the Golf Outings and donate to it fund. It has helped countless young people reach their educational goals.
- To date, the Metro Detroit Chapter has raised approximately \$175,000 for the scholarship fund.
