### Apa format book multiple authors. Apa book in text citation two authors. Apa citation for book with multiple authors.

If you cite a source with more than 20 authors, the in-text reference should only include the name of the first person listed as one of the authors of the source, followed by the word "etc." Names and initials of the first 19 authors those listed must appear in the full source citation (in separate commas), followed by three periods (...) and the last author listed. In this case, there is no need to use the & symbol.




