Free Quilt Block Pattern

Folded Corners

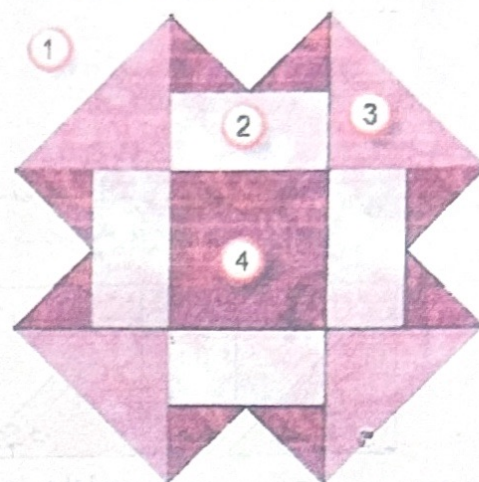
12" finished quilt block

Note: To achieve the effect of the "folded corners" in this quilt block you need to make sure that fabric 3 is a **medium** value fabric and fabric 4 is a **darker** fabric in the same colour family as fabric 3.

Fabric Placement



How-to Notes



Bisect square on one diagonal



Bisect square on both diagonals

*All seam allowances are 1/4" unless noted otherwise

Background fabric

Cut 2 squares 4 7/8" and bisect on one diagonal

Cut 1 square 5 1/4" and bisect on both diagonals

Fabric 2 (light fabric)

Cut 4 rectangles 2 1/2" x 4 1/2"

Fabric 3 (medium fabric)

Cut 2 squares 4 7/8" and bisect on one diagonal

4

Fabric 4 (dark fabric)

Cut 4 squares 2 7/8" and bisect on one diagonal

Cut 1 square 4 1/2"

→ Instead of bisecting squares as mentioned above, use the 4-at-a-time Flying Geese Method and the 2-at-a-time HST methods.
