
Bree Perry 🛪 Keynote Speaker

Bree Perry is the program officer for the Lend A Hand Fund at the Joyce Foundation. The Joyce Foundation is a private, nonpartisan philanthropy that invests in public policies and strategies to advance racial equity and economic mobility for the next generation in the Great Lakes region.

The Lend a Hand Fund was formed in response to the COVID-19 pandemic and the disproportionate impact on Chicago communities facing persistent structural inequities. The Foundation established the Lend a Hand Fund to provide support to front-line community organizations, supporting BIPOC-led and BIPOC-serving organizations that are hardest hit by COVID-19 and the impacts of systemic racism in Chicago.

She is also serves as the program officer for the foundation's journalism program. Previously, Bree was the program associate for the Fund and the Journalism program.

Prior to joining Joyce in 2013, Bree was a career strategist for Career Builder. She holds a bachelor's degree in accounting from DeVry University.
