Advent Wreath and Candles

The Advent wreath began as a way for families to reflect on the meaning of Advent in their homes. Today, most Catholic churches use an Advent wreath during their celebration of the Advent season. The wreath is usually made of evergreen branches formed into a circle. The circle represents eternal life. The green colour of the wreath represents hope. It is a symbol of our hope for salvation and eternal life that

Christ won for us on the Cross. The wreath is decorated with four candles, one for each week of Advent. One candle is lit on the Sunday at the beginning of each week of Advent. The first two candles and the fourth candle are usually purple. Purple is a colour of penance. It represents sorrow for our sins. The third candle is pink. This represents rejoicing because our Saviour is coming soon. The pink candle is lit on the third Sunday of Advent, which is called Gaudete Sunday, or Rejoice Sunday. The light from the lit candles represents Jesus, who is the Light of the World



Reflection on the Gospel for the First Sunday in Advent 2021

In life, the journey and the destination are part of one reality. The going is as important as the arriving, and one contributes to the other. Today's Mass suggests our approach should be similar. If we want to celebrate the First Coming of Jesus and prepare for his Second Coming, then the way to do it is to be aware of his coming into every moment of every day. The Scripture for today tells us that on the bus of life we should:

- a) Be ready to get off the bus at any point, that is, be ready to meet the Lord whenever he calls us to himself, whether that be in the very near future or many years away. The important thing is: Be prepared.
- b) Do not be afraid, do not worry. Fear, worry and anxiety do not solve any problems. Fear, worry, and anxiety are about things which do not yet exist and most probably will never exist as we imagine them. As Fr Tony de Mello used to say: "Why worry? If you worry, you will die; if you don't worry, you will die. So why worry?
- c) Improve our relations with the people around us. A good life consists not so much in the kind of work we do or how "successful" we are but how we have related with other people with family, relatives, friends, colleagues and total strangers.



Saint of the Week: St. Francis Xavier Feast: Dec. 3rd

St. Francis Xavier was born in Navarre, Spain in 1506.He was the third son of the president of the council of the king of Navarre, and in 1525 he journeyed to the University of Paris, the theological centre of Europe, to begin his studies. In Paris in 1534 he pronounced vows as one of the irst seven members of the Society of Jesus, or Jesuits. Francis was ordained priest on June 24, 1537. In 1540, Francis left Rome for India to preach the Gospel. Much of the next three years he spent on the southeastern coast of India among the simple, poor pearl fishermen. Francis's eyes, however, were now fixed on a land reached only five years before by Europeans, Japan. Having spent some years there, he died on Dec. 3rd, 1552, while waiting to be allowed into China. Even before his death, Francis Xavier was considered a saint, and he has been formally venerated as such by the Catholic church since 1622. In 1927 he was named **Patron of all Missions**.
