Saint of the Week: St Martha

The gospel of Luke includes what is arguably the most well-known story of Martha and her sister Mary, when they have Jesus to their home for dinner. Martha likely felt slightly flustered before his arrival, making sure everything was tidy and in order. Once he arrived, she was still

busy preparing the food. As a hostess, Martha was striving to ensure that Jesus felt welcomed and at home in her house, and was upset that Mary did nothing to help her. Such a request does not seem unreasonable, and Jesus understands that Martha's concern is legitimate. Yet he reminds her that while she is "anxious and worried about many things," Mary's desire to learn from Jesus is "the better part".

This account in Martha's life reminds us not to become anxious about the things we're facing to our spiritual detriment. Martha was so concerned with serving Jesus and those around her that she missed out on the opportunity to learn from him.

Reflection on the Gospel

In today's Gospel Jesus performs the miracle of the multiplication of the loaves and fishes. It is, of course, a symbol of the Eucharist; there

are deliberate signals that this is so. This incident is memorable, but it pales in significance when compared to the wonder of the Eucharist.



The small offering of the young man fed the people. God can make much of what we offer. Our attempts to live in his love and follow him are nothing without him. We never know where our efforts to love, to help, to support others may bear fruit. The miracle Jesus performed with the loaves and fishes convinced the large crowds who were following him that he was the prophet they were seeking. His teaching, healing, and feeding of the multitude made a profound impact on them and revealed his divine presence. Jesus is present in the everyday encounters of my life. He is present in those I







meet every day; and especially in the poor, the marginalised, and those in need of my help. When I open my heart and reach out in compassion and love to them, I am also meeting


First Friday calls in August

A warm welcome for the first World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly. Bishop Denis Nulty, chair of the Bishops' Council for Marriage and the Family has welcomed Pope Francis' World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly, as a timely reminder for the whole Church to be

close to all the elderly grandparents at this time of pandemic. **Bishop Nulty** said. "There have been so many unsung heroes and



heroines during the pandemic - grandparents and elders, including our older priests and religious – all who are to be applauded for how they have coped with the challenges and uncertainty brought about by the Covid-19 pandemic. As a society we have learned a lot from their stoicism and pragmatism in the face of so many challenges.

"Throughout his papacy Pope Francis has reminded us to value the many gifts of grandparents and the elderly. In his theme chosen for this inaugural year, I am with you always, the Holy Father is highlighting that promise of closeness that generations share with each other. "In the text of his inaugural message Pope Francis expands on this theme and assures us that he has been close to all those who have felt isolated and alone in recent months and that, even at the darkest of moments, the Lord continues to send angels to console our loneliness and to remind us that 'He is with us

always'. Pope Francis tells us that these angels sent to console us will at times have the face of grandchildren, while at other

times, the face

of family members, lifelong friends or those we have come to know during these trying times, when we have learned how important hugs and visits are for each of us."

Bishop Nulty concluded, "The World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly is being celebrated for the first time this year as part of a special Year on the Family to mark the fifth anniversary of Pope Francis' Apostolic Exhortation The Joy of Love (Amoris Laetitia). I would love to see parishes in every diocese across the country celebrating grandparents, elders, not forgetting our older priests and religious, who have given lives of dedicated service to their families and communities. I would also encourage parishes to ensure that

their local nursing care home is included in this annual celebration."
