Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time - January 29th 2023

Reflection on the Gospel Reading



Today's reading is the beginning of Jesus' Sermon on the Mount, which is found in Matthew's Gospel. In this reading we see that the people whom Jesus calls "blessed" and "happy" are not people we think of as blessed or happy . . . the poor in spirit, the meek, the persecuted. This Gospel is one of reversals. Jesus' blueprint for happiness reflects little of what the world might call happiness. "Blessed" is sometimes translated as happy, fortunate, or favoured. In other

words, Jesus is saying that divine favour is upon those who are poor, those who mourn, those who are persecuted. This news might have been welcome—and surprising—to the crowds who heard Jesus that day.

The Beatitudes can be understood as a framework for Christian living. Our vocation as Christians is not

to be first in this world, but rather to be first in the eyes of God. Matthew reminds us that those who act in the manner described in the Beatitudes will find their reward with God.

Feast of the Patron Saint of our Diocese of Ferns

Monday, January 30th is the Feast of St. Aidan, also known as Mogue the Patron Saint of our diocese. He was born around 550, probably in Co. Cavan. He studied under St. David in Wales and on his return to Ireland, founded a monastery in Ferns. He became Bishop there and was renowned for his generosity and kindness. He died in 626.

Do you find real joy in the work you are doing and in the life you are living? Do you find real pride in a job not only well





done, but perfectly done? Do you dislike anything that is done shoddily or half-heartedly? Is your heart so much in what you are doing and are you so conscious of the fact that you are doing everything to me and to my honour and glory that you cannot be satisfied with anything that is not 'just so'? It is as it should be. You should never be satisfied with a job done in half-hearted, begrudging manner. Do all that has to be done with joy and love, and let it include everything you do, from the most mundane job to those vitally important ones. See that your attitude is right in everything you undertake so that the right vibrations are put into it. What is more, you will find yourself enjoying it. (Eileen Caddy, *Opening Doors Within*)..
