# Reflection on the Gospel for the 25<sup>th</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time



The disciples in today's Gospel seemed to have thought that being part of Jesus' circle would bring them privilege and status. No sooner had Jesus spoken of himself as someone who would end up as one of the least than the disciples began to argue among themselves as to which of them was the greatest. They wanted power and, it seems, that they wanted power for its own sake. Jesus puts it to us today, 'those who want to be first must make themselves last of all and servant of all.' This ambition to serve is something that 'makes for peace and is kindly and considerate; it is full of compassion and shows itself by doing good.' Jesus implies that this is to be our primary ambition as his followers. In the

teaching of his disciples and of us all, Jesus performs a very significant action. He takes a little child and sets the child in front of his disciples, puts his arms around the child and declares that whoever welcomes one such child - a symbol of the most vulnerable people in society, welcomes him and not only him but God the Father who sent him. So, the message of today's Gospel is that we are called to serve those who, for one reason or another, are not in a position to help themselves. Jesus calls us to serve him as he comes to us in and through the weakest members of society. This is what he wants his church to be about.
