Reflection on the Gospel – 3rd Sunday of Advent (Year A)

The Third Sunday of Advent, often called Gaudete Sunday, invites us to pause in the midst of our Advent



waiting and rejoice. In the Gospel, John the Baptist is in prison and sends his disciples to ask Jesus, "Are you the one who is to come or should we

come, or should we look for another?" Jesus responds not with a direct "yes" or "no," but by pointing to the

signs of the Kingdom: the blind see, the lame walk, lepers are cleansed, the deaf hear, the dead are raised, and the poor receive good news. His answer reminds us that God's presence is revealed in actions of healing, restoration, and hope — not just in words. John's question reflects our human experience of uncertainty. Sometimes, like John, we may feel imprisoned by doubt, hardship, or waiting. Yet Jesus' reply invites us to look for God's work in the world around us — in acts of compassion,

Let this Sunday morning be filled with God's blessing for you! May He shower on you with such great joy that you can shine the love of Jesus all throughout the day.

in moments of reconciliation, in the quiet persistence of hope. Gaudete Sunday's rose-coloured candle and symbolize joy rooted in the assurance that God is always at work in the world. May this week's Gospel encourage us to open our eyes to the signs of God's Kingdom in our daily lives, and to become those signs for others through kindness, justice, and love.
