

Reflection on the Gospel for the 18th Sunday in Ordinary Time

In today's world, we are enticed on every front to accumulate wealth, possessions and status, but in today's Gospel, Jesus reminds us that when we die, our wealth, our possessions, and our status will not



matter. The only criterion we will be judged on is whether we have fulfilled the commandment to love. Today may be a good day to ask ourselves: Who and what is most important in my life? Is it money, status, possessions, esteem? Or is it the people that I love or the many individuals who are in need? Do I strive to make a difference in our world by my love, care, and generosity? Do I freely share the many gifts that God has given me? What we need most is the ability to reach out in love, the love that makes life better for others. Let us make our community a place where people look after each other. This is where true riches are to be found.

Gospel: Luke 12: 13-21) How Much is Enough?

Jesus warned against greed and stresses the foolishness of depending on material things for one's security, rather than on God.A certain amount of money and material possessions are necessary. Jesus' parable is not about need but about greed. The farmer was rich to begin with, but he still wasn't satisfied.

Greed is like a fire—the more wood you pile on the hungrier it gets. One of the chief problems of our times—people don't know when they are well off. Elvis Presley died at 42 from drug abuse. He owned 8 cars, 6 motorbikes, 2 planes 16 television sets, a vast mansion and several large bank accounts.

When the crow builds a nest in the forest, it occupies but a single branch. When the deer slakes its thirst in the river, it drinks no more than it needs at the moment. Why do humans have to hoard? Mahatma Ghandi was one of the greatest men in the twentieth century, yet he lived in a simple hut made of wood and mud. His possessions were the bare essentials. Possessions will never give us inner strength. They are the crutches of a spiritual cripple. People accumulate things and cling to them, because they give the illusion of security. But security cannot be found in possessions. It can be found only in God. (Flor McCarthy).

Heavenly Glory

And I thought to myself: how easily and effectively the earthly lights extinguish the heavenly ones.
