

Reflection on the Gospel for the Second Sunday of Advent



God chooses all kinds of unexpected people to be his messengers and prophets. He chose John the Baptist – a 'wild man' and rebel, homeless and anti-social, and gruff. He also had a message for his followers, and it was 'repent...'. However, for John, 'repent' meant far more than simply 'saying sorry' and moving on. John did not do grey; for him things were either black or white, take it or leave it. So, when he said to them "Repent" he was telling them that they could not have the Kingdom of God without repentance. However, rather than a God of 'wrath' and 'fire' who would destroy one's

enemies, the God Jesus revealed to

us was a God of love . The Kingdom revealed by Jesus did not come in power and glory. The Kingdom of God revealed by Jesus was for everyone, without exception. It was for the poor and sick, the persecuted and those treated unjustly, the gentle and meek, the suffering and sinners.
