



**Reflection on the Gospel for the 5th Sunday in Ordinary Time, Year A**



In this Sunday's Gospel, Jesus uses two simple images — salt and light — to describe the mission of His followers. Salt preserves, enhances flavour, and prevents decay; light dispels darkness and guides the way.

In the same way, our lives are meant to bring out the goodness in the world and light the path toward God for others. Jesus' words remind us that faith is not meant to be hidden or kept private. Just as light loses its purpose if covered, and salt becomes useless if it loses its taste, our discipleship loses its meaning if it does not touch the lives of others.

This is not about drawing attention to us, but about letting God's love shine through our actions — in kindness, justice, and compassion. In a world that can often feel divided, cynical, or weary, even small acts of goodness can be like a spark in the dark. A listening ear, a word of encouragement, a stand for what is right — these are ways we "let our light shine" so that others may see God's presence in the everyday.

This week, the Gospel invites us to ask: Where can I bring flavour and hope into someone's life? How can I be a light in a place of darkness? When we live as salt and light, we quietly but powerfully witness to the truth that God's love is alive and active in the world.

#### Part of the Message from Pope Leo for World Day of Sick

Theme: The gift of encounter: the joy of offering closeness and presence.

We live immersed in a culture of speed, immediacy, and haste – a culture of "discard" and indifference that prevents us from pausing along the way and drawing near to acknowledge the needs and suffering that surround us. In the parable, when the Samaritan saw the wounded man, he did not "pass by." Instead, he looked upon him with an open and attentive gaze – the very gaze of Jesus – which led him to act with human and compassionate closeness. The Samaritan "stopped,



approached the man and cared for him personally, even spending his own money to provide for his needs... [Above all] he gave him his time.”[1] Jesus does not merely teach us who our neighbour



is, but rather how to become a neighbour; in other words, how we can draw close to others.[2] In this respect, we can affirm with Saint Augustine that the Lord did not intend to show us who that man's neighbour was, but rather to whom he should become a neighbour. Indeed, no one is truly a neighbour until they freely draw near to another. Thus, the one who became a neighbour was the one who showed mercy.[3]

## International Day of Prayer and Awareness of Human Trafficking

"Peace begins with Dignity. A Global Call to End Human Trafficking" is the theme of the 12th International Day of Prayer and Awareness against Human Trafficking, established by Pope Francis and celebrated each year on 8 February, on the occasion of the Feast of Saint Josephine Bakhita a Sudanese woman and religious sister, enslaved from the age of seven, Saint Bakhita has become over time a universal symbol of the Church's commitment against human trafficking. According to the United Nations, an estimated 27 million people worldwide are victims of human trafficking, predominantly women, children, migrants, and people forced to flee their homes and which, while remaining largely hidden and underreported, is increasingly finding new forms of exploitation online. Each year on 8 February, thousands of people around the world join the International Day of Prayer and Awareness through prayer and awareness-raising initiatives in communities and parishes.
