

What Does Robert Say? The Parliamentarians of Psi April Is Parliamentary Law Month



Parliamentary Law is a consistent system of rules which govern procedure in all deliberative assemblies; founded upon certain fundamental principles originated in the unwritten customs of the House of Parliament in England; first compiled for use in this country by Thomas Jefferson, whose manual has been the foundation for rules used in the United States House of Representatives and Senate.

Parliamentary Law Month is celebrated in April to coincide with the birth month of Thomas Jefferson, who wrote the first American manual of parliamentary procedure in 1801. His Manual is unchallenged as the first to define and interpret parliamentary principles for our democratic republic and to offer a basic pattern of rules and a measure of uniformity for the legislative processes of the United States.

The rules of parliamentary law are constructed upon a careful balance of the rights of:

- the majority,
- the minority, especially a strong minority (greater than one third),
- individual members,
- absentees, and
- all of these together.

Under the rules of parliamentary law, a deliberative body is a free agent—free to do what it wants with the greatest measure of protection to itself and of consideration for the rights of its members.

The application of parliamentary law is the best method yet devised to enable assemblies of any size, with due regard for every member's opinion, to arrive at the general will on the maximum number of questions of varying complexity in a minimum amount of time and under all kinds of internal climate ranging from total harmony to hardened or impassioned division of opinion.

Parliamentary procedure is parliamentary law as it is followed in any given assembly together with rules the assembly has adopted. The purpose of parliamentary procedure is for the assembly to conduct its business in the most efficient way possible while considering the rights of its members. Henry Martyn Robert was the original author of Robert's Rule of Order, which has become the most widely used manual of parliamentary procedure and remains today the most common parliamentary authority in the United States. Now in its 12th Edition, it is the Parliamentary Authority of Iota Phi Lambda Sorority, Inc.



