





What Does Robert Say?

P.R.N. – Parliamentary Rules Noted The Parliamentarians of Psi



The Role of the Parliamentarian in Chapter Meetings

The parliamentarian is a consultant who advises the president and other officers, committees, and members on matters of parliamentary procedure. The president is free to appoint as her parliamentarian anyone in whom she has confidence. The parliamentarian's role during a meeting is purely an advisory and consultative one – since parliamentary law gives to the presiding officer (chair) alone the power to rule on questions of order or to answer parliamentary inquiries. After the parliamentarian has expressed her opinion on a point, the chair has the duty to make the final ruling and, in doing so, has the right to follow the advice of the parliamentarian or to disregard it. The parliamentarian's duties can extend beyond giving opinions to the presiding officer during meetings and include for example, assisting in the planning and steering of business to be introduced and interpreting bylaws and rules.

The parliamentarian:

- 1. Confers with the president (chair) on the agenda before the meeting in anticipation of parliamentary questions that might arise.
- 2. Sits next to the chair, so as to be convenient for consultation in a low voice, but the chair should avoid checking with the parliamentarian too frequently or too obviously.
- 3. Gives advice to the chair and when requested, to any other member.
- 4. Calls attention of the chair to any error in the proceedings that may affect the substantive rights of any member or may otherwise do harm.
- 5. Heads off a developing problem by providing suggestions to the chair, without waiting to be asked for advice.

 These consultations could require the assembly to *stand at ease*.
- 6. Speaks only if called upon for the most involved matters.
- 7. Has the same duty as the presiding officer to maintain a position of impartiality, and therefore does not make motions, participate in debate, or vote on any question except in the case of a ballot vote.



December Is Seasonal Affective Disorder Awareness Month

During the month of December, awareness is being built around seasonal affective disorder. Also referred to as SAD or seasonal depression, there is treatment available for this disorder and hope can be found for the **16 million Americans** struggling through it every year.

What is seasonal affective disorder?

Seasonal affective disorder is a form of depression related to the changing of seasons. Most sufferers live far from the equator where daylight becomes scarce in the winter months. Linked to a biochemical imbalance occurring in the brain, SAD can cause bouts of fatigue, depression, and social withdrawal.

What are the symptoms?

Seasonal affective disorder is more than just the "winter blues." People with seasonal affective disorder experience mood changes and symptoms similar to depression. These changes usually occur during the fall and winter months, and they can be distressing and interfere with day-to-day life.

Symptoms include:

- Feeling sad or having a depressed mood
- Loss of interest or pleasure in activities
- Change in appetite
- Change in sleeping patterns
- Loss of energy or increased fatigue
- Difficulty thinking, concentrating, or making decisions
- Thoughts of death or suicide

The omicron variant of the coronavirus has arrived in Texas; here's what you need to know

The omicron variant of the coronavirus has arrived in Texas, Harris County

Judge Lina Hidalgo said in a tweet.

A 40-year-old woman in Harris County with no recent travel history tested positive for the variant, Hidalgo said Monday.

The Texas Tribune also attributed the case to the Texas Department of State Health Services.

The omicron variant, first detected in South Africa, appears to have more than

30 mutations in the coronavirus' spike protein, which could affect how easily it spreads to people.

Pfizer says COVID booster offers protection against omicron

Pfizer said Wednesday that a booster dose of its COVID-19 vaccine may protect against the new omicron variant even though the initial two doses appear significantly less effective.

Pfizer and its partner BioNTech said lab tests showed a booster dose increased by 25-fold the level of so-called neutralizing antibodies against omicron.

The omicron variant of the coronavirus has been detected in North Texas

The <u>omicron variant has been detected in North Texas</u>, just days after Texas' first omicron case was identified in the Houston area.

The two cases involve a 35-year-old and a 40-year-old. Neither patient has a recent travel history, CBS 11 reported.



COVID-19 Guideline Updates





Remember, in addition to our national Bylaws and Standing Rules, all sorority members are expected to abide by any guidelines/ regulations developed by the National Board for the safety of our members. Sorors, in addition to the widespread highly contagious Delta Variant we are now faced with the Omicron variant, so we highly recommend that all members get the vaccine and to continue with virtual meetings where the infection rate is exceptionally high. After discussion with the National Executive Board and taking in consideration our diverse membership and the fact that we cannot guarantee that all of our members are vaccinated we are recommending the following:

CHAPTER & AUXILIARIES MEETINGS & ACTIVITIES:

- Facilities should be large enough to accommodate social distancing and have good circulation of air. Everyone must wear a mask, whether they are vaccinated or not.
- We will not ask for documentation, but we highly recommend that only vaccinated members attend in-person chapter meetings and
 activities. We recommend that the attached checklist be sent out to members before each in-person meeting or activity to
 ascertain their ability to meet in-person.
- 3. If you choose to go in-person, we recommend that you provide call in or login capability for members who are unable to attend the meetings due to compromised immune systems.
- 4. In addition to wearing a mask and social distancing, undergraduate chapters will adhere to the COVID-19 guidelines of their particular institution.
- 5. Chapter/Auxiliaries may resume social and community gathering with caution. *Recommend the wearing of mask and social distancing for all activities.
- You may resume participation in community activities wearing lota gear and a mask. Please practice social distancing for your and your family's safety.
- 7. You may resume partial in-person membership recruitment with limited contact, remember everyone has not been vaccinated. We highly recommend virtual informational and study groups. In-person meetings should be short in duration or limited to outdoor activities. We highly recommend wearing a mask and social distancing during all interaction with prospective members and members of the Lomepa Club.

In addition to wearing a mask and social distancing, undergraduate chapters will adhere to the COVID-19 guidelines for recruitment at their particular institution.

FUTURE IOTA LEADERS:

Now that children from 5-18 are eligible for the vaccine, you may resume in-person meetings & activities only with those youth who are vaccinated. FIL and FIL advisors must wear a mask when working with the public. We recommend that the attached checklist be sent out to all members before each in-person meeting or activity to ascertain their ability to meet in-person.

We will continue to assess the situation and make changes as needed.
