PSI HEALTH & WELLNESS: NATIONAL HANDWASHING MONTH

National Handwashing Month is observed in the month of December. This annual celebration is celebrated December 5-11, 2023. As we prepare to spend time with family and friends for the holidays it is essential to remember safety measures to ensure no one becomes ill on our watch. We should monitor ourselves accordingly when preparing food dishes for others as cross-contamination can easily occur in the kitchen.

Germs can easily be transmitted from the restroom to other places in the home with a simple touch. Allowing children to participate in cooking activities is one of the most natural and beautiful family activities such as making cookies for Santa, however, these little hands should also be monitored for safe handwashing to prevent illness.

Germs can be transmitted to other places by the following:

- Touch your eyes, nose, and mouth with unwashed hands
- Prepare or eat food and drinks with unwashed hands
- Touch surfaces or objects that have germs on them
- Blow your nose, cough, or sneeze into hands and then touch other people's hands or common objects

Washing hands should be done before and after the following events:

- · Before, during, and after preparing food
- · Before and after eating food
- Before and after caring for someone at home who is sick with vomiting or diarrhea
- Before and after treating a cut or wound
- After using the toilet
- After changing diapers or cleaning up a child who has used the toilet
- After blowing your nose, coughing, or sneezing
- After touching an animal, animal feed, or animal waste
- After handling pet food or pet treats
- After touching garbage

Handwashing is always the best regiment to use over hand sanitizer because: Sanitizers can quickly reduce the number of germs on hands in many situations. However,

- Sanitizers do not get rid of all types of germs.
- Hand sanitizers may not be as effective when hands are visibly dirty or greasy.
- Hand sanitizers might not remove harmful chemicals like pesticides from hands.

Let's shake on it: Finally, we love National Handwashing Awareness Week because it reminds everybody else - especially doctors and those who prepare the food we eat - to take cleanliness and hygiene seriously.



ADVENTURES IN PARLIAMENTARY PROCEDURE: WHAT SHOULD MEMBERS KNOW AND BE ABLE TO DO?

For Motions:

Members should have the knowledge and skills to use common motions during a meeting.

A member should know:

- The purpose and effect of the following motions: amend, refer, postpone, limit, and extend the limits of debate, previous question, request for information, reconsider, and rescind or amend something previously adopted.
- Common forms of amendment, including the motions to add, to insert, to strike out, and to strike out and insert words.
- The distinction between primary and secondary amendments.
- The distinction between standing and special committees.
- Common methods of appointing or electing committees.
- Basic committee procedure, including the role of the chairman, rules of debate in committees, and the manner in which a committee reports.
- Limitations on renewing a motion at the same meeting.
- The purpose and effect of giving previous notice of a motion.

A member should be able to:

- Draft a primary amendment that is germane to a main motion.
- Move, in proper form, the motions to amend, refer, postpone, limit and extend the limits of debate, previous question, request for information, reconsider, and rescind or amend something previously adopted.
- State, for each motion listed above, whether it is debatable, and the vote required for its adoption.
- Given two ranking motions from those listed above, determine which takes precedence over the other.
- Present a committee report containing a recommendation.
