Started in 1936 by Harlem postman Victor Green, *The Negro Motorist Green Book* was a guide published over three decades that helped African Americans travel the country safely, and with dignity, during a time of Jim Crow laws and segregation. The *Green Book* was also an indispensable resource for the era's successful Black-owned businesses and rising African American middle class.

THE EXHIBIT



The Negro Motorist Green Book, an exhibition developed by the Smithsonian Institution Traveling Exhibition Service (SITES) in collaboration with award-winning author, photographer and cultural documentarian, Candacy Taylor, offers an immersive look at the reality of travel for African Americans in mid-century America and how the annual guide served as an indispensable resource for the nation's rising African American middle class and evidence of a vibrant business class.

On Saturday, January 7, 2023, Psi Chapter ventured out to The Negro Motorist Green Book Exhibit. This exhibit was truly an eye opening experience of how Black Citizens used the Green Book, published by Victor H. Green in 1936, as a safe means to travel (lodging, food, gas and more) across the states.



Incidental Motions

A secondary motion can be made and considered while a main motion is pending and when it is in order, the secondary motion must be acted upon or disposed of before direct consideration of the main question can be continued. *Subsidiary motions*, *privileged motions* and *incidental motions* taken together are called *secondary motions*.

In the January Article, we considered the *thirteen ranking motions* comprised of the *subsidiary* and *privileged* motions. But what about the *incidental motions*?

Incidental motions relate, in different ways, to the pending business or to business otherwise at hand. The purpose of *incidental motions* is to provide a means of questioning procedure concerning other motions and must be considered before the other motion. *Incidental motions* are often used to clarify the parliamentary process or to adjust it as needed. There is not a rank order of *incidental motions*. *Incidental motions* include:

- Point of order
- + Appeal the ruling (decision) of the Chair
- + Suspend the rules
- + Objection to consideration of the question
- + Division of the question
- + Consider seriatim (by paragraph)
- + Division of the assembly
- + Motions related to method of voting and the polls
- + Motions related to nominations
- + Request to be excused from a duty
- + Parliamentary inquiry
- + Request for information
- + Request permission to withdraw or modify a motion
