Accounting for 1 in every 4 deaths, heart disease is the leading cause of death for women in the United States. The WISEWOMAN (Well-Integrated Screening and Evaluation for WOMen Across the Nation) program was created to help women understand and reduce their risk for heart disease and stroke by providing services to promote lasting heart-healthy lifestyles.



GOOD HEALTH WIN

Working with low-income, uninsured, and underinsured women aged 40 to 64 years, the program provides heart disease and stroke risk factor screenings and services that promote healthy behaviors. The WISEWOMAN program currently is administered through CDC's <u>Division for Heart Disease</u> and Stroke Prevention (DHDSP).

<u>Blood pressure</u> is the pressure of blood pushing against the walls of your arteries. Arteries carry blood from your heart to other parts of your body. Blood pressure normally rises and falls throughout the day, but it can damage your heart and cause health problems if it stays high for a long time. Hypertension, also called high blood pressure, is blood pressure that is higher than normal.

Facts About Hypertension in the United States

- In 2017, the American College of Cardiology and the American Heart Association published new guidelines for hypertension management and defined high hypertension as blood pressure at or above 130/80 mmHg. Stage 2 hypertension is defined as a blood pressure at or above 140/90 mmHg.
- Having hypertension puts you at risk for <u>heart disease</u> and <u>stroke</u>, which are leading causes of death in the United States.
- In 2021, hypertension was a primary or contributing cause of 691,095 deaths in the United States.


Rates of High Blood Pressure Control Vary by Sex and Race

Uncontrolled high blood pressure is common; however, certain groups of people are more likely to have control over their high blood pressure than others.

- A greater percentage of men (50%) have high blood pressure than women (44%).
- High blood pressure is more common in non-Hispanic black adults (56%) than in non-Hispanic white adults (48%), non-Hispanic Asian adults (46%), or Hispanic adults (39%).


Rates of High Blood Pressure Vary by Geography

High blood pressure is more common in some areas of the United States than in others. A map is included showing the rate of hypertension by county. However, this map likely underreports the true effect of hypertension in each state, because about 1 in 5 adults with high blood pressure is unaware of it and would not report having it.

ADVENTURES IN PARLIAMENTARY PROCEDURE Committees

A **committee**, as understood in parliamentary law, is a body of one or more persons, elected or appointed (or by direction of) an assembly or society, to consider, investigate, or take action on certain matters or subjects, or to do all of these things. A committee is not itself considered to be a form of assembly. Thomas B. Reed, a famous parliamentarian, once said, "The committee is the eye, ear, and hand, and very often the brain of the assembly. Free from the very great inconvenience of numbers, it can study a question, obtain full information, and put the proposed action into proper shape for final decision." Committees are the working machinery of an organization that handles both routine and complex tasks. It is in and by committees that the work of lota is done.

Why do we have committees?

When members are selected carefully, instructions are specific and accurate reporting can be anticipated, referring matters to committees provides an alternative for long debate in meetings of the assembly. Precious time can be saved, and overall operation of the assembly can be enhanced. Serving on committees also provides basic training for future leaders and offers an excellent means of drawing new or shy members into the true spirit and programs or projects of an organization. Do you want to be more involved in your chapter or learn more about the workings of lota? Join the various committees in which you have an interest and work.

There are two types of ordinary committees: standing committees and special committees. There is also a method by which the entire assembly can act with the freedoms of a committee known as the committee of the whole with two alternate forms. Review Robert's Rules of Order in Brief, 3 rd edition, chapter 19 or RONR (12 th ed.) 50 and RONR(12 th ed.)52 for more information about committees.


Future lota Leaders (FIL) Submitted by: Soror Joyce Hodges


