



What Does Robert Say?

P.R.N. - Parliamentary Rules Noted The Parliamentarians of Psi



The Role of the Parliamentarian in Conventions

A key consultant in the preparation for a convention (e.g., lota's Regional Conferences and National Conventions) should be the parliamentarian, who should be engaged well in advance. It is desirable that this person be a professional – the more seasoned in actual operating experience within organizations the better. Although she has the duty of giving parliamentary advice and opinions at convention meetings (where she should be seated next to the presiding officer), the parliamentarian's most important work may well be performed before the convention opens.

During the period of preparation and while the convention is in progress, she should serve as the principal adviser to the president (e.g., lota's Regional Director or National President), the officers, and the committee chairs regarding management of the convention as it relates to the actual transaction of business. The chair of the Credentials Committee, the Committee on Standing Rules, the Program Committee, the Resolutions Committee, and Elections Committee if there is one, and the standing committees who are to present business to the convention (e.g., Bylaws and Recommendations) should all consult with the parliamentarian during this time; and it may be advisable that she should attend certain meetings of these committees. The parliamentarian should always be present at the preconvention board meetings where a number of decisions bearing on business to come before the convention may be made.

Other duties of the convention parliamentarian could include writing the script for the presiding officer based on the proposed agenda, developing a handbook for the convention delegates, and conducting a delegates' forum to inform and prepare the delegates to fully participate in the convention.



January Cervical Health Awareness Month

January is Cervical Health Awareness month to raise awareness about HPV vaccination and prevent cervical cancer. Currently, 13,000 women in America have cervical cancer. Millions more have the HPV virus, which is the most common cause of cervical cancer. The critical thing to note this month is that deaths due to cervical cancer are preventable.

What is HPV?

Human Papillomavirus Infection, commonly referred to as HPV, is a prevalent virus. **Nearly 80 million people in the United States are infected.** This virus can be spread through sexual activity. Since many who are infected never exhibit any symptoms, it can be easily spread without realizing. This is why regular exams are so important.

Mild cases of HPV can produce genital warts, while extreme cases can lead to Cervical Cancer. There is no treatment available for HPV, which is why the vaccine is so important. Prevention is possible.

The HPV Vaccine

Doctors recommend that both boys and girls receive the HPV vaccine beginning at age 11 or 12. Receiving the vaccine at such an early age ensures a better and stronger immune response. Usually, only 2 doses are necessary for children under age 15. In adulthood, it may take up to 3 doses of the vaccine to achieve the same result. Individuals can receive the vaccine through age 45.

Beginning at age 21, women should receive a pap screening every year. Women over 30 should receive both a pap test and HPV test regularly. Most insurance plans cover cervical cancer screenings, so all preventative care should come at no additional cost to the patient. This makes it even easier to prevent Cervical Cancer.

Early Detection is Key

Regular cervical screenings can detect any abnormal changes in cells *before* they become cancerous. So even though there is no treatment, prevention is very simple. It's simple because all it takes is to keep up with your regular well check-ups.

Help us spread the word and promote awareness about Cervical Cancer prevention. The tragedy of deaths by Cervical Cancer can be prevented with regular screenings and follow up care. Visit our <u>Wellness Observance Calendar</u> for resources and information to help us spread awareness.



Please make sure that your chapter and regional websites indicate those scholarships that are specifically awarded by them and not National Scholarships. There is no reason that scholarship applications should be sent from around the country if the information is posted with clear directions. **Again, no National essay and/or scholarship applications are accepted without chapter endorsement and submission.**



COVID-19 Guideline Updates

the safety of our members in the forefront of everything we do. As we said at the beginning of this ordeal, you are expected to follow the CDC guidelines, in addition to the ones set by this organization. Remember, in addition to our national Bylaws and Standing Rules, all sorority members are expected to abide by any guidelines/regulations developed by the National Board for the safety of our members. Sorors, in addition to the widespread highly contagious Delta Variant we are now faced with the Omicron variant, so we highly recommend that all members get the vaccine and to continue with virtual meetings where the infection rate is exceptionally high.

CHAPTER & AUXILIARIES MEETINGS & ACTIVITIES:

- 1. Facilities should be large enough to accommodate social distancing and have good circulation of air. Everyone must wear a mask, whether they are vaccinated or not.
- 2. We will not ask for documentation, but we highly recommend that only vaccinated members attend in-person chapter meetings and activities. We recommend that the attached checklist be sent out to members before each in-person meeting or activity to determine their ability to participate.
- 3. If you choose to go in-person, we recommend that you provide call in or login capability for members who are unable to attend the meetings due to compromised immune systems.
- 4. Undergraduate chapters should follow the COVID-19 guidelines of their institution if they are not in conflict with lota guidelines.
- 5. Chapter/Auxiliaries may attend community gatherings/programs wearing lota paraphernalia, but with upmost caution. The wearing of mask and social distancing are required for participation in all activities and events.

MEMBERSHIP RECRUITMENT: UNDERGRADUATE AND GRADUATE CHAPTERS

- 1. You may resume partial in-person membership recruitment with limited contact, remember everyone has not been vaccinated. Because of the highly contagious omicron variant, informational, Lomepa pinning, study groups and inductions will be held virtually,
- 2. All participants must wear a mask and social distance during all interaction with prospective members and members of the Lomepa
- 3.In-person meetings should be short in duration and limited to outdoor activities, such as community service events. Mask wearing and social distancing must be observed.
- 4. You may not engage in any activity where you discuss private lota information in outdoor settings.
- 5. Undergraduate Chapters may follow the COVID-19 guidelines for recruitment at their institution as long as they do not conflict with the guidelines established by lota Phi Lambda
