## **March is Nutrition Awareness Month**

#### **Eating Right**

Nutrient-rich foods provide energy for women's busy lives and help to reduce the risk of disease. A healthy eating plan regularly includes:

At least three ounce-equivalents of whole grains such as whole-grain bread, whole-wheat cereal flakes, whole-wheat pasta, bulgur, quinoa, brown rice or oats. Three servings of low-fat or fat-free dairy products including milk, yogurt or cheese; or calcium-fortified soymilk. (Non-dairy sources of calcium for people who do not consume dairy products include calcium-fortified foods and beverages, canned fish and some leafy greens.)

Five to 5-and-a-half ounce-equivalents of protein foods such as lean meat, poultry, seafood, eggs, beans, lentils, tofu, nuts and seeds. One-and-a-half to two cups of fruits — fresh, frozen, canned or dried without added sugars. Two to two-and-a-half cups of colorful vegetables — fresh, frozen or canned without added salt

#### Iron-rich Foods

Iron is important to good health, but the amount needed is different depending on a woman's stage of life. For example, iron needs are higher during pregnancy and lower after reaching menopause. Foods that provide iron include red meat, chicken, turkey, pork, fish, kale, spinach, beans, lentils and some fortified ready-to-eat cereals. Plant-based sources of iron are more easily absorbed by your body when eaten with vitamin C-rich foods. To get both these nutrients at the same meal, try fortified cereal with strawberries on top, spinach salad with mandarin orange slices or add tomatoes to lentil soup.

#### Folate (and Folic Acid) During the Reproductive Years

When women reach childbearing age folate (or folic acid) plays an important role in decreasing the risk of birth defects.










## What Does Robert Say?

P.R.N. – Parliamentary Rules Noted The Parliamentarians of Psi



### Motions Which Bring a Question Again Before the Assembly

A motion which brings a question again before the assembly either by adoption or by its introduction, allows the assembly to consider again the merits of a question that has previously been disposed of in some way.

There are two ways to bring a motion back before the assembly. One way is called renewing a motion: If a motion is made and disposed of without being adopted, and later allowed to come before the assembly after being made again by any member in essentially the same connection, the motion is said to be *renewed* (RONR (12<sup>th</sup> ed.) §38). The second way is by using a group of motions that are described below:

- To Take from The Table (To Take a Motion from the Table)
   Allows the assembly to resume consideration of a motion or a series of adhering motions previously laid on the table.
- Reconsider (To Reconsider the Vote on a Motion)
   Allows a question previously disposed of to come again before the assembly for further consideration, within a limited time and with out notice, as if it had not previously been considered.
- Rescind or Amend Something Previously Adopted
   Rescind (Repeal or Annul) voids or cancels a motion previously passed.
   Amend Something Previously Adopted is the motion that can be used if it is desired to change only a part of the text, or to substitute a different version

#### Discharge a Committee

By means of the motion to *Discharge a Committee* from further consideration of a question or subject, the assembly can take the matter out of a committee's hands after referring it to the committee and before the committee has made a final report on it, such that the assembly itself can consider it.
