**P.R.N.** – Parliamentary Rules Noted The Parliamentarians of Psi

#### What Does Each Member Need to Know About Motions?

The National Association of Parliamentarians (NAP) has developed what is known as the NAP Body of Knowledge. It describes what Members, Leaders, and Parliamentary Consultants should know and be able to do to participate in or facilitate effective meetings.

For members, it defines what should be known and the skills required concerning Meetings, Motions and Rules.

For Motions, a member should know:

- The purpose and effect of the following motions: amend, refer, postpone, limit and extend the limits of debate, previous question, request for information, reconsider, and rescind, and amend something previously adopted.
- Common forms of amendment, including the motions to add, to insert, to strike out, and to strike out and insert words.
- The distinction between primary and secondary amendments.
- Common methods of appointing or electing committees.
- Basic committee procedure, including the role of the chairman, rules of debate in committees, and the manner in which a committee reports.
- Limitations on renewing a motion at the same meeting.
- The purpose and effect of giving previous notice of a motion.

For Motions, a member should be able to:

- Draft a primary amendment that is germane to a main motion.
- Move, in proper form, the motions to amend, refer, postpone, limit and extend limits of debate, previous question, request for information, reconsider, and rescind or amend something previously adopted.
- State, for each motion listed above, whether it is debatable, and the vote required for its adoption.
- Given two ranking motions from those listed above, determine which takes precedence over the other.
- Present a committee report containing a recommendation.

# Psi Chapter of Iota Phi Lambda Sorority, Inc. Remember § 9-11, Never For Get -9.11.01-

The **September 11 attacks**, commonly known as **9/11**,<sup>[c]</sup> were four coordinated suicide terrorist attacks carried out by the militant Islamic extremist network al-Qaeda<sup>[3]</sup>. <sup>[4][5]</sup> against the United States. On the morning of Tuesday, September 11, 2001, nineteen terrorists—directed by al Qaeda leader Osama bin Laden—hijacked four commercial airliners mid-flight while traveling from the northeastern U.S. to California. The attackers were organized into three groups of five members and one group of four, with each group including one designated flight-trained hijacker who took control of the aircraft. Their goal was to crash the planes into prominent American buildings, inflicting mass casualties and major structural damage. The hijackers successfully crashed the first two planes into the North and South Towers of the World Trade Center in New York City, and the third plane into the Pentagon in Arlington, Virginia. The fourth plane was intended to hit a federal government building<sup>[d]</sup> in Washington, D.C., but instead crashed down in a field outside Shanksville, Pennsylvania, following a passenger revolt that foiled the attack.<sup>[6]</sup> **From: Wikipedia, the free encyclopedia**
