JANUARY NATIONAL BLOOD DONOR MONTH



According to the Association for the Advancement of Blood & Biotherapies (AABB), January is recognized as National Blood Donor Month in the United States. The winter months often see a decline in donations due to holiday festivities, harsh weather, and the prevalence of cold and flu season, leading to a heightened risk of blood shortages. This month honors blood donors during this crucial period and serves as a reminder of the vital importance of donating blood. Types of blood donations include:

Whole blood

• A flexible donation that collects about a pint of blood, which can be used as is or separated into components. Whole blood is often given to trauma patients and people undergoing surgery.

Power Red

- Also known as a double red cell donation, this donation collects two units of red blood cells while returning the plasma and platelets to the donor. Power Red donations are often given to:
 - Trauma patients
 - Newborns
 - · People with sickle cell anemia
 - Anyone suffering blood loss

Platelet

• Platelets are tiny cells in your blood that form clots and stop bleeding. Platelets are a vital element of cancer treatments and organ transplant procedures, as well as other surgical procedures.

Plasma

• During an AB Elite donation, you give plasma, a part of your blood used to treat patients in emergency situations. AB Plasma is used in emergency and trauma situations to help stop bleeding.






