

Passport and Visas

Passports are required by all visitors to Gibraltar, except EU nationals who can use a valid national identity card instead of a passport.

British citizens may enter Gibraltar with a passport. They may also enter Ceuta with a passport.

Those non EU nationals who have acquired a shengen visa for entry into Spain will be able to visit Ceuta without any further visa requirements as it is a Spanish enclave.

For example, US citizens with a shengen visa for entry to Spain may enter Gibraltar without a visa. Likewise with Ceuta.

For entry into Ceuta You need a Schengen visa to enter Ceuta if you are not a citizen of an EU country or hold a passport from a country which requires a visa to enter Europe/Schengen area.

So for example you are a US citizen visiting Spain on a shengen visa so you may enter Ceuta with no further paperwork required.

Other than that, the restrictions on entering Ceuta are purely as if you were entering Spain.

Please note for entry into Ceuta all the same due Covid travel restrictions apply as if entering Spain.

It is your responsibility to make sure all the covid travel requirements are met and you have full responsibility for any visa requirements.
